WEST DIVISION

BOURNE BRAVES

Doran Park, Upper Cape Tech, 220 Sandwich Road, Bourne
www.bournebraves.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 1. Bear right off the exit and take the first left onto Adams Street. At the end of Adams Street, turn left on Sandwich Road (Route 6). Proceed along the canal. After the ice rink, the school driveway is on the left. The field is up the steep driveway behind the school.



COTUIT KETTLEERS

Lowell Park, 10 Lowell Street, Cotuit
www.kettleers.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Turn left on Putnam. Follow to Lowell Avenue on the right. The parking lot and field is on the right.



FALMOUTH COMMODORES

Guv. Fuller Field, 790 Main Street, Falmouth Center
www.falmouthcommodores.com | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at the end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right on Route 149 until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Continue on Route 28 through Mashpee Rotary to Falmouth Center. The field is on the right behind the police station.



HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS

McKeon Field, 120 High School Road, Hyannis
www.harborhawks.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 7 (Willow Street). Bear left at the end of ramp. Follow Willow through lights across Route 28 onto Yarmouth Road. Turn right at the end onto Main Street. Keep in left lane on Main Street to High School Road Ext which dead-ends at the field.



WAREHAM GATEMEN

Clem Spillane Field, 54 Marion Road at Viking Drive, Wareham
www.gatemen.org | Take Route 6 to Exit 1. Bear right off the exit at the first left onto Adams Street. At the end of Adams, turn left on Sandwich Road and follow to the Bourne Bridge. Take Route 25 across the bridge and proceed to Exit 2 (Glen Charlie Road to Route 6, Wareham). After passing through Wareham Center, Route 6 bears left up a hill. The field is on the left behind the Town Hall parking lot.



2015 ORLEANS FIREBIRDS OBITUARIES

The Orleans Firebirds marked the passing of several good friends and supporters over the past year, all of whom made significant contributions to our organization.

Richard L. "Dick" "Bresh" Bresciani

JANUARY 16, 1938 - NOVEMBER 29, 2014

If ever anyone was destined to live their life in baseball, it was Dick Bresciani. Stats were his specialty and his passion. While he was a student at UMass-Amherst, he was a statistician for the Cape League, reporting games to the Cape Cod Times. In 1972, after serving in UMass' sports information office, he took a job with the Red Sox in the PR department, compiling each day's material for the sportswriters and, as the years went on, accumulating an unparalleled knowledge of the team's history and players. Bresh held many titles with the Sox, and was a Vice President and the Team Historian when he lost his battle with leukemia last year. He was a strong advocate for the Cape League, serving on its Board of Directors while fostering the relationship between the Sox and the league. A kind and generous man, Bresh was the recipient of many awards, and he was a member of three Halls of Fame: the Cape League (2001), UMass Athletics (2003), and the Red Sox (2006). Fittingly, the Sox have renamed Fenway's press box the "Bresh Box" in his honor.

Lewis A. "Doc" Dalburg, Jr., M.D.

FEBRUARY 22, 1930 - JULY 29, 2014

Longtime fan and staunch supporter "Doc" Dalburg of East Orleans passed away during the 2014 season. He was a fixture on the bleachers behind home plate, enjoying perfect summer evenings with his many friends, especially the late Carl Peterson, who died in 2011. Doc built a long and distinguished career as an ophthalmologist, serving thousands of grateful patients both in his private practice in New Britain, CT, and at many area hospitals. He also taught at both Yale Medical School and the University of Connecticut Medical-Dental School, and maintained membership in several medical societies prior to his retirement. Besides the Firebirds, Doc enjoyed the Red Sox and the Patriots, golf, fishing, growing vegetables, and building lasting friendships.

Arthur L. "Art" Quirk, Jr.

APRIL 11, 1937 - NOVEMBER 22, 2014

A left-hander from Dartmouth College, Art Quirk played for Orleans in 1958, and in his debut struck out 17 and also went 3-for-5 at the plate in the win over Dennis. He followed that two weeks later with a 15K game, and he ended the season with a sparkling 9-0 record, a 1.12 ERA and a league-best .475 BA. Signed by Baltimore in 1959, he spent 5 years in pro ball, including one year with the Orioles and one with the Senators. Following baseball, Art forged a highly successful business career in Connecticut, and devoted himself to tireless efforts on behalf of the special needs community, serving many organizations and founding his own, Horizons, Inc. Art was inducted into the Cape Cod Baseball League Hall of Fame in 2009.

Donald B. Walsh

MARCH 31, 1927 - JANUARY 27, 2015

A native Cape Coder, Don grew up in Orleans and devoted his adult life to serving first his country during World War II, and then his community for over 30 years. He joined the Orleans Police Department in 1958, and rose through the ranks to become its chief. For several of his years as a patrolman, Don worked with a "summer cop" named Tom Yankus, legendary Orleans Cardinals pitcher, coach and field manager. After retirement, Don spent summers with the Park Department, patrolling the beach and supervising beach parking lots. A warm and outgoing man with a ready smile, he also enjoyed many evenings sitting on the terraces at Eldredge Park with his wife, Anita, cheering for the boys of summer and visiting with countless friends.

John H. Freeman

MARCH 16, 1938 - JANUARY 31, 2015

Born and raised in Orleans, John graduated from Harvard College and earned his master's in education from Tufts. He played varsity baseball for Harvard, and he was a catcher for both Orleans and Yarmouth-

Dennis in the Cape League during the town team years. John was a strong supporter of the league through the years as it grew in prominence, developing and nurturing top baseball talent. He was instrumental in the selection of his former manager, Laurin "Pete" Peterson, for induction into the league's Hall of Fame. During his career teaching math and science, John coached both baseball and soccer, and returned to Orleans each summer to work with youngsters through the recreation department and Pony League baseball. After retirement, he joined the Park Department and greeted beachgoers from the booth at Nauset, and he was the "Voice of the Storm" on the PA system at Eldredge Park for the men's amateur soccer team.

Paul O. Fulcher

SEPTEMBER 6, 1951 - FEBRUARY 6, 2015

While local folks remember Paul Fulcher as the longtime superintendent of the Orleans Parks and Beaches Department, which includes Eldredge Park, the jewel in the center of town, they might not know that he was also one of the original incorporators of the Orleans Athletic Association when it was formally organized in 1978, and he was on the team's volunteer committee for several years. Born in Eastham and raised in Chatham, Paul first served his country in the US Army, and then his chosen hometown of Orleans until his retirement in 2012. Besides his devotion to the protection and improvement of the town's numerous natural resources and attractions, he served on many other town committees. During his tenure, Eldredge Park was recognized by Baseball America as the best summer baseball venue in the nation. Community service was always a joint venture in the Fulcher family, and Paul and his wife, Margie, were honored as Citizens of the Year in 2014.

Bill Enos

JULY 7, 1920 - DECEMBER 10, 2014

Born and raised in Cohasset, Bill Enos' career in baseball spanned eight decades. While still in his teens, the left-handed hitting first baseman played for Orleans in 1936. Though he never reached the majors, Bill played for minor league and independent organizations from 1939 until 1952, interrupted only by his service in the US Navy during World War II from 1942 to 1945. He was a player/manager in the Browns' system when he made the move to scouting. He also worked for the

Kansas City/Oakland Athletics and the Seattle Pilots/Milwaukee Brewers until he joined the Boston Red Sox in 1973, where he remained until his retirement in 2001, spending the last part of his career as a consultant. He was the first scouting liaison for MLB to the CCBL, working tirelessly to solidify the league's status as nation's premier collegiate summer league. He was inducted into the league's Hall of Fame with the Class of 2000.

Richard J. "Dick" Sullivan

OCTOBER 24, 1930 - MAY 1, 2015

Once Dick Sullivan decided something was worth his commitment, he brought the full force of his considerable energy to bear on it. Born in Quincy and holding degrees in Education from Springfield College and New York University, he served in the US Army and then began his career at Hofstra University, first as a coach and then as Dean of Students. He moved to Cape Cod in 1970 to become Dean of Students at Cape Cod Community College, a position he held until retirement in 1999. He also embarked on a parallel career in volunteerism and public service, touching countless lives and earning the nickname, "Mayor of Cape Cod." Dick became involved with the Cape Cod chapter of the March of Dimes, hosting their annual Telerama for 40 years and receiving the Elaine Whitelaw Volunteer Service award in 2003. He helped found WE CAN (Women's Empowerment through Cape Area Networking), was a past president of the Area Board of the Mass. Dept. of Mental Health, and served on innumerable boards and committees. Dick was honored with the "Service Above Self" award by Hyannis Rotary, received the first annual "Citizen of the Year" award from United Way of Cape Cod, and the Chatham Rotary "Person of the Year" award. He was inducted into the Cape Cod Senior Softball Hall of Fame in 2011 after his team won the world championship in 2008, and four national championships. He served as both commissioner and president of the Cape League, a unique achievement, and remained active with the league in many other capacities until the end of his life. Dick was inducted into the league's Hall of Fame in 2002.







ELDREDGE PARK

Home of the Firebirds

Welcome to historic Eldredge Park. Named "the best summer collegiate park in the nation," in 2004 by Baseball America, this picturesque park has served the town of Orleans for over 100 years. Over this time, substantial work has been completed to maintain, improve and modernize the park, most recently through private donations and without a single penny of local taxpayer support. Today, Eldredge Park provides the town with a beautiful facility and ambiance once described by Philadelphia Reporter Joe Parillo as "a Norman Rockwell painting come to life."

Back in the early 1900's, a local gentleman named Lewis Winslow "Win" Eldredge (1861-1944) acquired about 250 acres of land in central Orleans in "consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desires to provide a playground for them."

In 1966, major steps were taken to modernize the park. The facility expanded to include a music band shell, tennis courts, picnic areas and other recreational fa-

cilities provided for in the master plan. Significantly, the field configuration was changed, moving home plate from near the existing left-field foul pole to its current location. Coinciding with this reconfiguration, a new irrigation system was added, along with new soil. The "new" Eldredge Park was "an incredible diamond of velvet turf infield on a beautiful site." The new park debuted on July 23, 1967 when it hosted the Cape Cod League Baseball All-Star game.

One of the most distinctive elements of Eldredge Park is the steep hill that runs all the way down the right side of the field, which for years was almost impossible to sit on comfortably. That problem was solved in 1985 when Fred Perreault suggested terracing the entire hill, creating relatively level tiers on which fans could place chair and blankets. In addition to added fan comfort, capacity was expanded to around 6000, creating a unique setting that is the envy of community ballparks throughout New England.

In 2004, the Yawkey Foundation began making a series of

\$150,000 grants to each of the 10 CCBL teams. In 2009, Orleans and Yarmouth-Dennis became the last teams to receive grants. Staged in phases, and with the addition of community donations, Eldredge Park underwent \$322,000 worth of improvements.

Phase 1 was completed in 2010 and involved construction of state-of-the-art 46' long dugouts, complete with New England styled bead boarding. A knee high padded brick backstop was built, new safety netting that extended 180' down each foul line was added and new foul poles and a flagpole in centerfield were erected.

Phase 2 was completed in 2011, focused on improving the playing surface. The entire infield was excavated to a level 5 feet underground, and then layered with new clay and sod. Sophisticated laser-guided instruments were used to level the field. Warning tracks were widened to 15' to conform to NCAA guidelines. Finally, both bullpens were fully restored to their original condition and the safety netting was raised another 20'.

Phase 3 was completed prior to the 2013 season and included a new sprinkler system. Fred Perreault and John Martin also cleared out two overgrown and unsightly groves, above the home plate area and adjacent to the left field foul pole, greatly enhancing the expansive, open feel of the park. Finally, bleachers were converted from wood to aluminum and new sets were added beyond the outfield fence.

Over the last 100 years, Eldredge Park has served the town of Orleans in many ways. The town has coupled a vision with an unparalleled commitment from residents, local business owners and countless volunteers to build, maintain and constantly improve the ballpark. George Mitrovich, a San Diego Civic Leader, summed up Eldredge Park in a 1998 Letter to the Boston Globe, "some teams play in ballparks with lights, some without. Some play in forgettable surroundings and some, like the Cardinals in Orleans, play in a sylvan setting so transcendently beautiful one's breath is swept away." ○

Orleans 2005 Championship Season

A 10-Year
Anniversary
Retrospective
on a
Magical Season

From 2002-2004, Orleans Manager Carmon Carcone compiled a record of 79-51-4 (.604), including a Cape Cod League Championship in 2003. The program was rolling and expectations for 2005 were high. Suddenly, before the season even began, the organization suffered a significant loss when Carcone accepted a coaching position with the University of Maryland, leaving a huge and unexpected void at the top. Kelly Nicholson, who had successfully coached Orleans' pitching staff over the previous 4 years, was an obvious choice to succeed Carcone as manager. However, before accepting the role, Nicholson consulted with many, including a few who would become key members of his first coaching staff. "I said we're all in this together. I'll accept the job if you join me on my staff." Those others turned out to be Chris Beck (pitching coach), Mike Clement (1st base coach/defense), Robb Gorr (hitting coach/3rd base coach) and Scott Jellous (bullpen coach).

Said Nicholson at the time, "I'm really honored and completely humbled. I think Orleans is the best place," he went on, "but obviously I'm biased. The people of Orleans are great. The Orleans Athletic Association is outstanding, with Ron Conte, Sue Horton and the rest." Looking ahead to that 2005 campaign, Nicholson

was optimistic. "On paper, our guys look pretty good" he said of a roster that included 12 players from the California. "Although everyone starts with a clean slate, I like what I see."

On this 10-year anniversary of Orleans' last CCBL championship, we re-live that magical season, which included a wild Eastern Division pennant race, a thrilling 3-game playoff win against the arch-rival Chatham A's


and ultimately a CCBL championship over the Bourne Braves. Along the way were spectacular performances, thrilling moments and memories for a lifetime, which will forever be part of Orleans lore. We hope you enjoy this trip down memory lane.

July 4th

Orleans 4 (11-6), Chatham 1 (8-7), Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 3,326

The Cardinals came back the following night with another 4-1 win, this time behind 6 innings of one-run ball by lanky ace Brad "The Body" Meyers (Loyola Marymount), running his record to 2-0. The save went to Wright, his 6th. Leadoff hitter Emmanuel Burriss (Kent State), who started the season on a temporary contract, collected two hits and

scored a run. A day after stranding 12 runners on base, the A's were frustrated again, leaving 10 aboard in this one. The win extended the Cardinals lead in the Eastern Division to 6 points.

July 10th

Orleans 5 (14-7), Chatham 4 (11-8), Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 3,116

Despite striking out 12 times, the Birds notched their 14th win in dramatic fashion, as Burriss ended it with a walk off RBI single. Singleton started the 9th by reaching base with a walk, stole second, moved to third on Jason Jacob's (Georgia) ground out before

scoring on Burriss' hit. Wright (2-0) pitched a scoreless 9th to earn the win. In the bottom of the 3rd, Chatham second baseman Aaron Reza (Oklahoma) collided with RF Anthony Smith (St. John's) in foul territory and was taken away in an ambulance. The win maintained the Birds 6 point lead over the A's.

July 22nd

Chatham 4 (19-12), Orleans 2 (21-11), Veteran's Field, Chatham. Attendance: 3,878

Chatham closed Orleans' Eastern Division lead to just 4 points in beating the Birds behind starter Robert Woodard (North Carolina), who hurled 7 plus innings, scattering 8 hits but just two runs in improving his record to 5-0. Brett Pill (Cal-State Fullerton) homered for the Birds in a losing cause.

August 7th –
Regular Season Finale

Orleans 3 (30-14), Chatham 2 (28-15-1), Veteran's Field, Chatham. Attendance: 5,555

Only a single point separated these rivals in a wild Eastern Division pennant race with playoff home field advantage on the line. Chatham entered the game white

hot, winning 12 of their last 15, closing Orleans' mid-summer 10-point lead to 1 in the process. The Birds staved off the A's by winning 7 of their last 9 to set up the show down.

Adding more intrigue was a three-way race for the batting title between Chatham teammates. Entering the final game, Chris Coghlan (Ole Miss; .354) held a slight lead over Alex Presley (Ole Miss; .349) and Baron Frost (USC; .346).

Nicholson selected Andy Graham (UC Santa Barbara) to start for the Birds, while Schiffner countered with Steve Richard (Maine)

Chatham opened with a run in the 1st when Frost rocked Graham's 0-2 pitch for a double, easily scoring Presley, who had walked to start the frame. The A's threatened again in the 6th with a lead-off double by Longoria and a walk by Coghlan. However, Graham bowed his neck, whiffing his final batter before reliever Daniel Albritton (Florida Southern) struck out DH Jacob Dempsey (Winthrop) and SS Todd Frazier (Rutgers) to end the inning.

The Birds finally broke through with back-to-back RBI singles from Pill and Colin Curtis (Arizona State) for a 2-1 lead. The damage could have been worse if

not for a brilliant relay from Frost to Coghlan to catcher Nick Derba (Manhattan), nailing the speedy Burriss at home in a bang-bang play.

In the home half, Orleans right-fielder Matt Camp (North Carolina State), who played SS for the A's the summer before, preserved the 2-1 lead with a sensational catch over the right field fence, robbing Adrian Ortiz of a game tying home run. "One of the two best catches I have ever seen," reflected Nicholson. "Matt played with his hair on fire all summer long."

Chatham answered in their 8th when an RBI single from Josh Morris (Georgia) plated Frost, knotting the game at 2 heading to the 9th inning.

Uribes opened the Bird 9th with a broken bat single down the right field line and moved to 2nd on a passed ball. With two outs, Pill singled to score Uribes, giving the visitors a 3-2 lead heading to the bottom of the 9th. Wright ended the A's night and hopes for home field advantage by retiring the side in order.

In yet another indication of this heated rivalry, at least on the field, the game featured 3 HBPs, with Orleans' Burriss and Singleton getting plunked, along with Chatham's Derba.

Eastern Division Playoffs Preview

Although Orleans won the regular season series with Chatham 4 games to 2 holding the A's to just 16 runs, they didn't face either Andrew Miller (6-0) or Jared Hughes (7-0). "Pitching and defense will be the key, and we've got the best two pitchers in the league in Andrew (Miller) and Jared (Hughes), said A's Chris Coghlan. "I don't see us losing to anybody in a best-of-three series."

"Those guys are loaded", said manager Nicholson of the A's. "They have very good pitching and eight guys made the All-Star team. We'll have our work cut out for us. John (Schiffner) does a great job. It'll be fun, Chatham and Orleans."

Indeed, the series proved to be a classic, one of the best in modern Cape Cod Baseball League history.

Game 1 – August 9th

Chatham 6, Orleans 3, Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 9,259

Schiffner sent ace Andrew Miller to the mound, while Nicholson countered with his best, Brad Meyers.

Chatham broke through with an unearned run in the 2nd when Garrett Bussiere (California) singled home Morris, and extended their lead to 2-0 with yet another unearned run in the 5th.

Orleans finally answered in their 6th when Curtis tripled home Singleton, who had doubled to open the frame, and then tied the game in the 7th on an RBI double by Jason Jacobs (Georgia). Chatham came right back in the 8th when Frazier's infield grounder scored Coghlan, taking a 3-2 lead into the bottom of the 9th. Miller, who gave up only 3 hits and two runs, was relieved by Lutz, who had not surrendered a single run in 25 innings of regular season work. Shockingly, on his first pitch, Brett Pill homered to tie the game, sending the Eldredge crowd into delirium.

Both teams failed to score in the 10th despite loading the bases. Chatham's Ortiz scored the go-ahead run on a passed ball, then Josh Morris' singled off Orleans closer Wright to make the score 6-3. Lutz retired the Birds in order in the 11th to end the 3:21 minute thriller.

Of note, attendance of 9,259 was the second largest ever recorded in CCBL history. The 50/50 raffle winner received a cool \$2,050 that night.

Game 2 – August 10th-11th

Orleans 5, Chatham 2, Veteran's Park, Chatham. Attendance: 6,758

Game two in Chatham featured all the twists and turns of Charles Dickens novel. The 7pm game was in the 4th inning when fog started to roll into the venerable park, not an uncommon site in the summer. Birdman Uribes opened the inning with a double and subsequently scored on a single by Pill. In the bottom of the frame, following a towering 2-run homer by the A's Gary Bussiere, the visitors walked off the field, claiming they couldn't pick up the ball within the dense fog.

The umpires huddled and decided to delay the game until 9pm. To keep the huge crowd entertained, several Birds formed a human bobsled on the first base line. Fellow Bird Curtis donned his uniform upside down and ran around the field, creating the il-

lusion that he was running on his hands. Ultimately, the game was suspended with Chatham leading 2-1, to resume the next day at 1pm.

With the sun shining at Veteran's Field, there were no worries about fog, only whether Orleans could force a pivotal game three later that night in Orleans. In the 7th, with Chatham still holding the 2-1 lead and only nine outs from winning the series, Pill led off with a walk. Perry then bunted, and when Chatham pitcher David Huff failed to get Pill at 2nd base, the Birds had the go-ahead runner aboard. Orleans' Chris Pettit then doubled down the right field line, scoring two runs and giving the Birds a 3-2 lead. They added single tallies in the 8th and 9th, leading 5-2 heading the bottom of the 9th. Orleans pitcher Brant Rustich (UCLA) "started" the day and was simply sensational, going all 5.1 innings, yielding just one hit

while whiffing 6. He retired 10 out of the last 11 A's hitters, including all three in the 9th, to preserve the win. "His best outing of the season, by far," said Nicholson. Fans then made the short drive up Route 28 for pivotal game 3 at Eldredge Park that night.

Game 3 – August 11th

Orleans 9, Chatham 7, Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 6,066

Orleans regular season finale win versus Chatham paid off as the Birds enjoyed the support of another huge Eldredge Park crowd for pivotal game 3. Chatham chose Jarred Hughes to start, who led the league with 7 wins in the regular seasons. Orleans countered with Lee Hyde (Georgia Tech). The A's wasted no time jumping to a 1st inning, 2-0 lead. Orleans quickly answered with a run of their own, as Pill hit a sacrifice fly to score one, and Steve Singleton's run scoring single in the 2nd knotted the game at 2. The Birds added another run in the 3rd to lead 3-2. Once again, Chatham answered, this time on a solo homer by Frazier, breaking his 0-9 series slump with one swing. The A's then added another run to lead 4-3 in the 5th.

Not to be undone, Orleans' Burriss doubled home a run in the bottom of the 5th. David Uribes (Pepperdine) followed with an RBI single and later scored on a wild pitch, giving the Birds a 6-4 lead. Orleans added three more runs in the 5th, taking a commanding 9-4 lead into the bottom of the 8th. Facing an insurmountable deficit, and after leaving 12 men on base and 29 in the series, frustration boiled over when Chatham's Lutz threw a 3-0 pitch behind Pill, who had been hit twice earlier the game. The dugouts cleared and words were exchanged, but Chatham skipper John Schiffner and Orleans' Kelly Nicholson, along with home plate umpire Peter Hall, were able to restore order before blows were thrown. All told, Chatham pitchers hit five Orleans

Wright threw two perfect innings to clinch the Eastern Division title and send the Birds to the CCBL Championship series against Western Division titleist Bourne.

Championship Series

The Bourne Braves (26-17-1) experienced another successful season under Manager Harvey Shapiro, winning the Western Division by 6 points over Cotuit (22-19-3). The Braves regular season team ERA was 2.27 (2nd in the CCBL), with a batting average of .225 (8th) in scoring 190 runs (4th). None of their regulars hit over .258 on the season.

Game 1 – August 12th

Orleans 1, Bourne 0, Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 4,593

In a rematch of the 2003 Championship Series won in a two-game sweep, Nicholson opted to start Andy Graham in the opener. Shapiro selected a well-rested 6'7" right-hander Greg Reynolds (Stanford; 2nd overall selection in 2006 MLB draft by the Colorado Rockies), who was 2-3 in the regular season, but with a sparkling 1.70 ERA and a WHIP (walks plus hits per 9 innings pitched) of just 0.962. Graham was solid, going 7.1 innings, yielding 6 hits, one

BB while striking out 7. Reynolds, however, was simply sensational, tossing 8.1 innings of shutout baseball while yielding just one hit, a 4th inning double by Uribes.

A scoreless tie entering the home half of the 9th, Burriss ("our table-setter, our sparkplug all year," said Nicholson) walked to lead off the inning. After Jacobs flied out, Reynolds was relieved by Romas Hicks (Georgia State; led league with 23 appearances), who ironically pitched for Orleans in 2004. Hicks promptly walked Uribes, then uncorked a wild pitch to move Burriss just 90 feet from home plate. After Curtis was intentionally walked to load the bases, Pill hit a high fly in foul territory, near the 1st base dugout. Burriss, determined to score, tagged up and blazed home. Hicks, to end his disastrous outing, failed to cover home plate. When asked about the play, General Manager Sue Horton recalled 3rd base coach Gorr said he simply sat back and "choked on the smoke" while watching Burriss score the winning run. Coulon relieved Graham in the 8th and received the win.

Game 2 – August 13th

Bourne 10, Orleans 1, Coady Field, Bourne. Attendance: 3,111

With their backs against the wall, Shapiro chose J.R. Crowell (Tulane) as his starter. He answered the call, pitching 6.1 in-

nings, giving up only 3 hits and 0 earned runs. Albritton took the hill for Orleans and pitched well over 5.2 innings, yielding 4 hits and two runs while striking out 6.

Bourne broke open the game in the 6th with 4 runs and added 5 more in the 7th, roughing up Bird David Coulon (Arizona), who surrendered 8 runs while retiring just two batters. Brave reliever Andrew Carigan (North Carolina) blanked the Birds over the final two innings, forcing a pivotal game 3 back at Eldredge the following night.

Bourne pounded 14 hits, with three each from Robbie Widlansky (Florida Atlantic) and Brett Bartles (Duke). Orleans' anemic offense could only muster 5 hits and one run.

Game 3 – August 14th

Orleans 13, Bourne 1, Eldredge Park, Orleans. Attendance: 6,815: **Orleans Wins the CCBL Championship**

Despite their offense going dormant in the first two games (6/55, .109) Nicholson was optimistic. "We've bounced back all season. I knew we were going to score some runs."

Harvey Shapiro sent ace Forrester Cory III (William & Mary; 4-1, 1.99 ERA, 58.2 IP on in the regular season) to the mound on only 3 days rest after he went 8 innings in beating Cotuit 5-2 to clinch the



Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome Coach Nicholson back for his 15th summer here – his 11th as Field Manager, the longest tenure for an Orleans skipper in the “modern era” (1963-present).

Kelly (or Coach K as he’s known in the pitching fraternity) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholar-athlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University.

After earning his bachelor’s degree in business administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master’s degree in education from LMU. He was the head coach of the Loyola HS Cubs for eleven seasons, where he led the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount’s pitching coach, and each year the Lions won the WCC title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K’s staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 Ks in 401 IP. All told, Kelly’s

pitching staffs have led the CCBL in ERA an astounding 7 times.

Co-winner of the Hossfeld Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became the field manager in 2005, and was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach K was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2), but a heartbreaking 1-0, 18-inning loss to the eventual CCBL Champion Harwich Mariners ended the team’s playoff run. Under his leadership, Orleans is a perennial playoff contender, reaching the final round in 2013 against Cotuit, despite losing several key players to injury. Coach K’s overall winning percentage of .566 leads all active CCBL managers.

It’s no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league and in the wider baseball community; he’s a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they’ll see a first class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm.

Kelly recently established his “ABC” or Academy of Baseball and Character, where young players “learn to play the game the right way.” We can attest to that. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his fifteenth summer. ○


Coach Craig returns to Cape Cod for his seventh season with the Firebirds as the team's primary hitting coach and he'll also run the offense. Coach Hallberg was a three-sport star at Barron High (WI) in baseball, soccer and basketball. On the diamond, he was a 3-time All-State performer and in 2004 was recognized as the Northwest Wisconsin player of the year. Amazingly, he didn't strikeout once during his junior and senior seasons.

Coach Hallberg started his college baseball career at the University of Illinois at Chicago, where he was named Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American, and was the most difficult hitter in the nation to strike out. He played for Orleans in the summer of 2006 (see story, page 42), and transferred to Florida State for his junior season and garnered first team All-ACC honors in 2007, hit .360 and recorded the highest fielding % in school history for a SS. In the three years of college, Coach Hallberg was 1st team All-Conference three times, and 2-time All-American, with a career .362 BA.

Coach Hallberg was a 9th round draft selection (234 overall) in the 2007 MLB draft by the Arizona Diamondbacks. He played 5 seasons in the minor leagues finishing his last two seasons in Triple-A with the Reno Aces. Coach Hallberg earned a career .277BA, .977 fielding % in 5 seasons.

This year Mark will be working primarily with the defense and coaching first base. We welcome Mark back to Orleans and wish him well as a first-year assistant coach. ○

In 2004, Bill was a 1st round draft pick (#13 overall) by the Montreal Expos. He made his Major League debut with the Washington Nationals on June 3, 2006 at the age of 22, against the Milwaukee Brewers, earning a 1-pitch win. In 2006, Bray was traded to the Cincinnati Reds, where he finished his career in 2012.

Over those seven years, Bray made 258 appearances, posted a 13-12 record with a career ERA of 3.74. Following a shoulder injury, Bray announced his retirement on March 16, 2014.

In 2015, Bill served as an assistant baseball coach at Jamestown High School in Williamsburg, Virginia while finishing his degree at William & Mary. In April he was inducted into the Tribe's Athletics Hall of Fame and will begin studies at W&M Law School in September.

An interview with Bill Bray

Former Cardinal ('03) and Veteran Major League Pitcher Bill Bray returns to Orleans as the Pitching Coach

First of all, welcome back to the Firebirds and the Cape Cod Baseball League. How did this opportunity to serve as the pitching coach present itself?

Over the years, and when traveling during my playing days, I've been able to stay in touch with Kelly, Carmen (Carcone) and Steve DeBlasi, my coaches during our 2003 championship season. What a special group of guys. Quite recently, Kelly reached out to me to talk about the position. Obviously I accepted and am thrilled to be here.

Speaking of the Bird's 2003

CCBL championship season, what are your memories from that time?

First and foremost, I met my wife, Elaine. Her family has had a place in Yarmouth for years, coming to the Cape since the 1920s. One of my teammates on the team had a girlfriend who worked with Elaine at Cuffy's, in Chatham. That's how we were introduced.

I recall we started the season slowly, losing our first four or five (actually 0-4). So here I am, participating in a public outing in town, and someone asks me "are you guys ever going to win?" I began to wonder myself. Then we just took off. We had a great team, a great group of guys. The playoffs really stand out. Everyone bought in, and we committed to each other, that hey, if we're going to stay here an extra two weeks, we might as well win it all. The excitement of the games, seeing thousands of people at Eldredge Park, lawn chairs everywhere, standing room only, up and down, all along the outfield. That was so cool, a college guy playing in an atmosphere like that.

I also remember working at CVS on Main Street, stocking shelves, getting there at 7:30 in the morning, working to noon or 1pm. Then grabbing something to eat and going to the ballpark. I loved it.

Do you stay in touch with your host family?

Yes, I see them every year. Sid, Nancy and Jocelyne Smith. I stay in touch with Don and Gini LeSieur as well. They've been a huge part of my life. Such wonderful friends have come out of my time that summer. Of course, coming to the Cape with my wife and visiting with her family....there are just great memories all over the place.

You spent seven years in the Big Leagues (2006-2012), making 258 appearances for the Nationals and Reds, while posting an impressive 3.74 career ERA. Looking back, was there a hitter you thought was most intimidating?

The toughest hitters, to me, were guys that hit for average. I was never intimidated by a hitter. The only time I was in awe of a hitter was the first time I faced Derek Jeter, as a

rookie. I was like, oh my God, this is Derek Jeter.

Do you remember the result of that at bat?

Oh yeah, I walked him. After that I swore I'd never be in awe of another hitter.

What goes through your mind when you're facing a big at bat?

Hit your spots.

Did you have to guard against being too pumped up, to fight adrenalin?

I wouldn't say fight adrenalin, more channeling it. You fight your nerves, which can turn into adrenalin. From there you fight your adrenalin. Over amped was never really an issue I thought I had.

The guys that were most difficult for me were guys like David Eckstein. Guys with incredible bat control who hit for average and weren't trying to hit home runs every pitch.

are one step ahead of the game, it feels like. They know every single hitter, have kept books on them, all their tendencies. They know hitters weaknesses, how they are adjusting in the box. Great catchers counter by calling the right pitch and location.

I'll give you a situation. It's 0-2 with a runner on 3rd, and I'm going to through this ball in the dirt. You had to know the catcher would block it, there's no second thought. When you have that kind of relationship with your catcher, he knows you, almost better than you know yourself out on the mound. There is just a level of comfort that's hard to explain.

So who was your favorite battery mate?

Gosh, I pitched to some great catchers. My favorite was Ryan Hanigan, who just signed with the Red Sox. He just knew what you were thinking out there. Ramon Hernan-

The guys trying to hit home runs, guys like a Ryan Howard or Prince Fielder, if you didn't hit their bat, you had a really good chance of getting them out. It was that mistake, that hanging slider, that fastball you left over the middle. They wouldn't miss those mistakes.

Speaking of Howard and Fielder, they hit a combined .071 against you, in 28 at bats. What was your secret?

Sliders, fastballs in, show them something in and pitch them away, because they were looking to pull the baseball. Sliders bouncing across the plate, or down and away.

What is the difference between a good catcher and a great catcher?

Preparation and the amount of effort they put into blocking pitches. When you talk about a great catcher, they are a commander on the field. They see everything, The great ones

dez was awesome, Brian Schneider, David Ross. I feel really fortunate; I pitched to some great catchers.

How are you staying close to the game since your retirement last spring?

I've been writing for Sporting News for a few months now. I kind of write when an idea hits me. I was pretty involved with the Players Association. Some things have come up, like changing the strike zone. I kind of laugh, pitchers getting the upper hand a bit and the league wanting to change the rules.

There's a brewing controversy that baseball games are too long. In fact, MLB will experiment with a pitch clock in the minor leagues. What's your take?

I think that's a bad idea. I think there are other ways to speed up a game. Do I think games are getting too long? Yeah, I do. All the pitch-

ing changes simply take more time. However, I don't think we need to compete with football or basketball. Those are limited time sports, while a baseball game, theoretically, could never end. Rule 8.04 says the pitcher has 12 seconds to deliver the ball, but it's never been enforced. They could have a pitch clock with a horn... I'm in my windup and all of a sudden a horn goes off? The umpire can then view a computer monitor to see if I got the pitch off in time? Imagine that.

I do applaud Commissioner Manfred for coming in and asking questions. That's a good thing. I'm pretty sure out of this will come some good solutions. I particularly like the minimum 3-batter rule for relievers. Also, as a pitcher I suggest getting rid of the DH. Although I'm laughing as I say it, I'm pretty sure that facing a pitcher is a heck of a lot easier than facing David Ortiz four times a night.

You spent your entire MLB career in the National League. How do you feel about the DH?

I don't mind the DH. I think I had one AB in the majors, although I would have liked to have hit. In fact, I would have been more proud of a base hit than anything else.

Shifting to your new role with the Firebirds, how would you describe Kelly's coaching style?

He's laid back, and treats you like adults, the best-of-the-best in college baseball. He's going to let you go out there and do your thing, earn your innings and your role. With so many great players, he wants to give them all playing time and be seen. Play against the best and be seen by scouts in the best possible light. He creates a fun atmosphere for the players. He'd always say, "hey lefty",

and shook my hand left-handed. I loved playing for him.

What's your own pitching philosophy? What will you emphasize in working with this year's Firebirds pitchers?

Be aggressive. No emotion on the mound, other than aggressiveness. Attack the hitters, that's our plate, we're going to pitch inside, and away. We're going to go after these guys that haven't played a ton of wood bat baseball. We're going to throw quality breaking balls; we don't just flip things up there for strikes. We attack, everything is sharp.

The other things is, if you (players) buy in, want to win and play as a team, you can learn, do great things and have the summer of your life. You can make a name for yourself and move up the draft. I was relatively unknown before playing on the Cape and I ended up being drafted in the first round (#13 overall in 2004, to the Expos). It's possible to create something for yourself on the Cape. That's something I want to stress to these guys, to just buy in and play as hard as they can.

What are the scouts looking for in pitchers?

Focus on pitching, not on the radar gun or other distractions. Competing every night, doing the best you can. Also, carry yourself the right way. Scouts don't want to see negative emotions, throwing fits, arguing with umpires. Let me argue with the umpires. How you look, your appearance. They want to see guys compete all summer.

Our players should realize that Kelly knows all these guys (scouts). Someone is always watching. If you work hard, day in and day out, you'll get noticed, by a scout, a coach or an agent. It's important to put in the

work, the effort, every single day.

When assessing a hitter, are there any stats you look at in particular?

I look at strikeout numbers and the number of walks. Does he have a good eye? I never paid much attention batting average. I didn't want to know if he was hitting .350. As far as pitching I never looked at my stats the whole year. I trusted the catchers to know the hitters better than me. My job was to throw the best pitch possible, that you think is best. Most of the time that was what the catcher calls, but occasionally you have to go with your own gut.

I understand you are finishing

up your degree at William and Mary. What's that like going back to school?

Going back is easier than it was the first time. I'm better at time management. I know what I want to do, putting in much more effort now. I want to work in the front office somewhere in baseball, the players association or for a franchise. The immediate plan is to go to W&M law; I've been accepted there, and will start classes in September.

Again, welcome back to Orleans and good luck this summer.

Thank you. I'm really excited to be here. ○

ORLEANS 'BIRDS IN THE CAPE COD LEAGUE HALL OF FAME

Roy Bruninghaus

Roy Bruninghaus was a perennial Cape League All-Star for three decades for Orleans during the 1930's, 1940's and 1950's, with several years off for pro baseball and World War II. He began his CCBL career in 1933 and ended it in 1955. He led the Cardinals to an impressive six championships in 1947, '49, '50, '52, '53 and '55. When not pitching, he played first base and outfield with impressive batting statistics. A graduate of Millbury High School, Roy attended Holy Cross, where he compiled an 18-2 record before signing with the Boston Red Sox in late 1930's. Overall, he was captain and team spokesman for the Cardinals during their glory years.

Major League Baseball Strike in 1981. He advocated for Fred Ebbett to become Commissioner and participated in meetings with MLB executives in support of the switch to wooden bats. In 1988, Ford was instrumental in sending the CCBL All-Stars to the Boardwalk & Baseball Tournament, where they won the tournament despite being the only team to use wooden bats. He is past president and GM of the Orleans Cardinals. The outstanding relief pitcher in the CCBL is called the Russ Ford Award in his honor.

Nomar Garciaparra

After being selected to the 1992 U.S. Olympic Team, Garciaparra played shortstop and was the Team MVP on the 1993 Orleans Cardinals team that captured the CCBL Playoff Championship. He was the seventh leading hitter in the league (.321), collecting 50 hits and 10 doubles to go along with one home run, 18 RBI and 17 stolen bases. Garciaparra was named recipient of the 10th Player Manny Robello Award. He was an All-Academic and All-American at Georgia Tech, where he was a teammate of fellow Cape League Hall of Fame inductee and Red Sox catcher Jason Varitek. After being a first round draft pick in 1994, Garciaparra burst onto the major league scene with the Boston Red Sox as the 1997 American League Rookie of the Year and won back-to-back AL batting titles in 1999 and 2000. Garciaparra retired from baseball following the 2009 season.

Cal Burlingame

Cal was a Cape League All-Star in the 50s. During his time in the league he played with Cotuit, the Barnstable Barons, Yarmouth and Orleans. In '54 he was a player on the Orleans' team which traveled to Wichita for the NBC tournament. He could play at any position, but was a standout in the outfield and as a pitcher. In 1946, he was signed by the Boston Red Sox. After his playing days was over, he umpired in the Cape League for six seasons.

Phil Corddry

A native of Bethesda, Maryland, Corddry entered the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2014. With a league-best 9-2 record, 92 innings pitched and a league-high 108 strikeouts, the Maryland southpaw was the top pitcher in the Cape League with the 1968 Orleans Cardinals. Ending with a 1.76 ERA, he was chosen to start for the Lower Cape Division in All-Star game held in Chatham, giving up a walk and striking out two in two innings. Following his phenomenal summer on the Cape, Corddry was drafted by the Boston Red Sox in the 1969 draft (2nd round) and played in the Red Sox minor league system from 1969-72, advancing as far as Class-AA.

Russ Ford, President, Cape League;
President/GM, Orleans Cardinals

Russ Ford served as Cape League President from 1978-83 and during that span helped foster the growth and popularity of the league, especially during the

Bob Hansen

The University of Massachusetts first baseman/outfielder played four seasons (Cotuit 1966-1968 and Orleans 1969) in the Cape League and was an All-Star the final three years, starting each game. In 1969, he finished third in batting at .385 and led the league with 38 RBI and a .680 slugging percentage. He also placed second in home runs (7) and doubles (9). He was voted to the 1969 All-League Team at first base. His 16 home runs and 21 doubles place him in the top 20 all-time. The 21st draft pick of the expansion Seattle Pilots (AL) in 1969, he hit .242 with two home runs and 13 RBI in 82 games in played parts of two MLB seasons (1974 and 1976) after the Pilots moved to Milwaukee and became the Brewers.

Lance Niekro

A native of Lakeland, FL and from Florida Southern College, Niekro enjoyed a

CCBL MVP season for the Cardinals in 1999, compiling a .360 batting average with 13 homers and 44 RBIs. He also finished first in hits (62), slugging percentage (.640) and total bases (110). He was selected to both the mid-season and final All-Star teams. Niekro returned to the Cape to play nine games in 2000, batting .297. A nephew of Hall of Famer Phil Niekro and son of former MLB pitcher Joe Niekro, Lance was drafted by the San Francisco Giants in the second round of the 2000 amateur draft. Niekro played four seasons in the majors with the San Francisco Giants before retiring following the 2007 season.

Jim Norris

A slick-fielding center fielder, Norris enjoyed two stellar seasons for the Orleans Cardinals in 1969 and '70. The University of Maryland player was selected recipient of the Pat Sorenti Award as Most Valuable Player of the league in '69 when he batted a league-leading .415 with four homers and 20 RBI. That season, he was second in the league with 37 runs and 17 stolen bases, and set a league record with 59 hits. Norris came back with another All-Star campaign in 1970 when he batted .333 with one homer, 22 RBI, 31 runs scored and was second in the league with 19 stolen bases. He led Orleans to the playoffs both seasons, batting .321 during the '69 postseason and a lusty .421 in 1970. Jim played four years in the major leagues, including 1977-79 with the Cleveland Indians and 1980 with the Texas Rangers.

Laurin "Pete" Peterson

A true pioneer of Cape League baseball, Peterson was a strong-armed catcher for the Orleans AC's baseball club and went on to manage the team for 14 years, winning seven Cape League championships (1947, '49, '50, '52, '53, '55 and '57). In the late '50s, he became one of the first Cape managers to start recruiting notable college players. Many of his charges, such as Cal Burlingame, Roy Bruninghaus, Buzzy Wilcox and Art Quirk, became CCBL Hall of Famers themselves. In 1962, Peterson was a key member of the committee which brought about the historic merger of the Lower Cape and Upper Cape leagues which began play as the Cape Cod League in 1963.

Frank Thomas

A native of Columbia SC, Thomas played for the Orleans Cardinals in 1988, was a CCBL All-Star and led the team to the Championship series, ultimately losing to the Wareham Gatemen. Thomas was drafted by the Chicago White Sox in the 1st round (7th pick) of the 1989 amateur draft and spent 16 years of his 19-year career with the Chicago White Sox. The two-time American League MVP played in five All Star Games and won four Silver Sluggers. He finished with 521 homers and 2,468 hits. Thomas was elected to the Major League Hall of Fall in Cooperstown, NY and was inducted on July 27th, 2014. At that time, Thomas, Carlton Fisk (Orleans, '66) and Pie Traynor (Falmouth, '19) were the only former Cape League players in baseball's Hall of Fame.

Matt Wieters

A native of Charleston, SC, Wieters played for the 2006 Orleans Cardinals (now Firebirds) and was a winner of the Robert A. McNeece Outstanding Pro Prospect Award that year. He posted a .307 batting average and belted eight home runs, ranking second in the league in both categories. He also pounded out 39 hits and had an on-base percentage of .417. The Baltimore Orioles made Wieters its first-round draft pick (fifth overall) in 2007 where he signed a \$6 million bonus contract. He made his major league debut May 29, 2009, was selected for the 2011 and '12 MLB American League All-Star teams and is a two-time Gold Glove winner.

Allen (Buzzy) Wilcox

Played 17 years in the league in parts of three decades in the 1940s, '50s and '60s. He banged out three hits and drove in four runs to lead Orleans to a 7-6 win over Chatham for the Lower Cape League Championship. Wilcox was synonymous with the league's town team concept during the middle of the 20th century.

Former Orleans slugger Frank Thomas

('88) inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, NY

ORLEANS CARDINALS

Slugging Frank "Big Hurt" Thomas became just the third Cape Cod Baseball League alumnus voted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in Cooperstown, N.Y., joining Harold "Pie" Traynor (Falmouth, 1919) and Carlton Fisk (Orleans, 1966).

Thomas, voted into Baseball's Valhalla along with former Atlanta Braves 300-game winning pitchers Greg Maddux and Tom Glavine, played for Orleans in 1988 and led the Cardinals to the Cape League championship series, where they lost to Wareham, two games to one, led by Mo Vaughn and league batting champion Chuck Knoblauch, who hit .361 for the Gate-men.

"I know Orleans Cardinals/Firebirds family and fans are celebrating Frank's selection to the Baseball Hall of Fame," said Orleans general manager Sue Horton. "Carlton (Fisk) was here such a short time and he doesn't really acknowledge he was here, so we're thrilled to have


a Cardinal in Cooperstown.

"I remember the amazing Class of '88 and have one of those coveted baseball card sets, and when old-timers get together, there are always stories from that year that get told. Frank had a wonderful friendship with his host family, the Marinos, and tickets were always waiting for them at Fenway whenever Frank was in town; it wouldn't surprise me if members of the family are at the induction."

The Big Hurt got off to a slow start power-wise during his summer in Orleans, but caught fire when the Cape Cod summer heated up in August.

"When Frank Thomas played for Orleans, he had a habit of giving pitchers the inside corner because he didn't want scouts to see he couldn't get the wood bat around quick enough on an inside pitch," said former Orleans pitching coach Tom Yankus. "As a result, this heralded power hitter from Auburn couldn't hit the long ball in hitter-friendly Eldredge Park and had only one home run as the last week of the regular season approached. Then, on an early August night in Wareham, Frank put on one of the greatest displays of raw power that Cape League observers had ever seen.

"Frank's college buddy, Bo Jackson, was scheduled to come to Boston the next day with the Royals, and Frank decided to finally unveil the weapon Bo had given him before the season, a black Louisville Slugger with Bo's name chiseled onto the barrel. All season, Frank kept that bat wrapped



in white tissue paper in its long, thin cardboard container. He never used it for fear it would break on one of those inside pitches.

"But with Bo at Fenway and Frank heading up to see him after the Wareham game, he knew he could get another bat from Bo if necessary. So at Wareham's Clem Spillane Field, he unwrapped the tissue paper, folded it, set it on the bench and drew out THE BAT.

"Wareham's field would never be confused with a bandbox. It was more like an airport. Its dimensions were 350 in left, over 450 in center, and 370 in right. On this particular night, it would not have mattered if the fences were halfway to Onset Beach because this was Frank's night to quiet all the naysayers.

"In his first at-bat, Frank launched a missile far over the left center field fence and the football bleachers. The second at-bat, he pulverized a fastball that cleared the center field fence and disappeared into the mist. The third

at-bat, he gave the Wareham right fielder a closeup view of a space shot headed into the darkness. He did not move an inch as he craned his neck in admiration.

"It was indeed a night to remember. Thank you, Bo."

A two-time AL MVP, Thomas hit .301 with 521 homers and 1,704 RBIs in 19 seasons with the Chicago White Sox, Toronto and Oakland. He was inducted into the inaugural Cape League Hall of Fame in 2000.

Thomas was part of a Cape League crop that produced an all-time record 40 future major leaguers in 1988, including 15 players who lasted 10 years or longer in the big leagues. Five players from that year eventually slammed at least 300 career homers, including Thomas who tied fellow Hall of Famers Ted Williams and Willie McCovey for eighth place on the all-time MLB home run list. ◊

OUR CLINIC PHILOSOPHY

The co-ed clinic is dedicated to teaching the fundamentals of baseball. Skills and technical instruction will cover throwing,

catching, fielding, hitting and base running. All level of abilities are identified, and all instruction is based on the age, ability and playing

experience of each boy and girl. A high instructor-to-child ratio ensures that each boy and girl receives personal attention and direction.



GENERAL INFORMATION

All participants receive instruction from the manager, coaches and Firebirds, as well as a t-shirt, and an opportunity to "run with the 'Birds.'" 'Campers of the Week' also will be awarded at the conclusion of each clinic.

Clinics are held weekly beginning June 22 and continuing through July 31 at Nauset Middle School (adjacent to Eldredge Park). They run from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Water breaks and a nutrition break will take place

daily, so attendees should bring snacks and water, in addition to their baseball gear.

Cost is \$100/week or \$25/day. There also are specialty clinics in pitching, catching and hitting for \$40 per session. You

can sign up at orleansfirebirds.com or register at the beginning of each clinic week beginning at 8:30 a.m. at Eldredge Park. Semi-soft baseballs are used for beginners. Required batting helmets will be supplied. ○
