SCOTT PICKLER



Position: Manager Experience: 22nd season Alma Mater: San Diego State

Scott Pickler is one of the most respected veteran community college coaches in the nation. The 2016 CCCAA Coaching Achievement Award winner is in his 35th year with the Chargers, leading Cypress to five state championships (1991, 1994, 1997, 2003, 2013) and four runner-up

finishes (1996, 1999, 2004, 2007). Pickler, who served as a coach for the 1995 USA Baseball National Trials, has a career record of 981-493. He also has coached for 18 years in the prestigious Cape Cod Summer League. In 2004, 2006, 2007, 2014 and 2015 he led the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox to the Cape Cod League Championship. 71 of Pickler's Cape League players have moved on to play in the Major Leagues.

Pickler took over a struggling Cypress program in 1985 and quickly turned the Chargers into a respected California powerhouse. He has been chosen the National Coach of the Year for California Community Colleges four times.

With all of his professional accomplishments, Pickler's biggest victories and proudest moments come when he sees his athletes move to four-year universities or the professional ranks. 310 student-athletes have received scholarships, and 120 plus players have been selected in the Major League Draft. There have been 20 former Chargers who have been brought up to the Majors in Pickler's tenure, earning over \$137 million dollars.

Before coming to Cypress, Pickler had an outstanding high school coaching career. In six seasons at Savanna and Loara high schools, he posted a combined record of 123-36 and won the CIF championship with his 1983 Loara squad. Pickler is a 1968 graduate of Savanna High School where he was named Athlete of the Year and inducted into the Hall of Fame alongside his brother (Brad Pickler) in 2016. He attended Cypress College and earned all-conference recognition under Coach Larry Mercadante. He earned a degree in physical education from San Diego State University and played second base for the Aztecs.

Coach Pickler was inducted into the Cypress College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017 and the American Baseball Coaches Association (ABCA) Hall of Fame in 2019.

Pickler has been married to his wife Sharon for over 40 years. She worked as a teacher's assistant for autistic children. Together they have two children, Kari and Jeff. Kari graduated from UCLA and was the song leader for the Bruins. She also danced on Broadway for the musical "Big". She is currently married to her husband Chris and they

have two children, Bailey and Brandt. Jeff played college baseball, one year at Cypress College earning all-league status then went to the University of Tennessee. Jeff was the SEC Player of the Year, consensus 1st team All American, and academic all American in 1998. He eventually signed with the Brewers and spent eight years playing professional baseball. Jeff's wife Erica is a science teacher.

JUSTIN ROW



Position: Assistant Coach Experience: 1st season Alma Mater: University of South Carolina

Justin Row is from La Verne, California. He spent his first two years of his collegiate baseball career at Fullerton College in Fullerton, California. At Fullerton, Justin was awarded the All American, and All State teams. From there he received

a scholarship to play division 1 baseball at the University of South Carolina. After his two years there, Justin went on to be a student assistant coach, working under Mark Kingston and his staff.

JACOB CAPLES



Position: Assistant Coach Experience: 1st season Alma Mater: Arkansas-Monticello

Jacob Caples just completed his first season with the University of Arkansas-Little Rock Trojans in Little Rock, Arkansas. Caples served as the bullpen coordinator during games, assisting with the hitters and threw batting practice for the Trojans. Before Little Rock, Caples

spent three seasons assisting with the Arkansas-Monticello Bollweevils in Monticello, Arkansas. There he helped the Bollweevils to three championship seasons and a few offensive school records in BA (.321) and HR (79). Caples is a Texas native from New Caney, Texas. After high school, he went on to play for Western Texas Junior College and West Texas A&M. Caples holds a Master's degree in Physical Education and Coaching from Arkansas-Monticello. He is currently engaged to Victoria Bayer and plans to get married this fall.

STEVEN PHILLIPS



Position: Assistant Coach Experience: 5th season Alma Mater: Hope International

Steven Phillips began coaching career in 2017 when joining Hope International University working with their infielders and hitters. In 2017 the Royals won their first ever regular season conference championship in only their second year of program history. The same year they won their regional and made it to the College World

Series in Lewiston, Idaho. The next year HIU made it back to their second straight conference tournament championship. In 2019, he took over the recruiting coordinator job. They won the conference tournament championship and made it back to a regional. This is his third consecutive summer coaching for Yarmouth Dennis.

ROBERTO MERCADO



Position: Assistant Coach Experience: 6th Season Alma Mater: Fitchburg State '03

The Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox announced the addition of Roberto Mercado to the team's staff in the spring of 2014. Mercado is in his fifth season as head coach of the New Britain High School Hurricanes in New Britain, Connecticut. New Britain High School is in the CCC West Conference, considered one of the premier

conferences in the state of Connecticut. In Mercado's inaugural year (2011), the Hurricanes captured their first conference title since 1984 and also made the LL state semifinals for the first time since 2001. Mercado has coached 13 All-Conference players and two All-State players in his time as head coach. Prior to coaching at New Britain High School, he coached the New Britain Fall Legion baseball program and won state titles in 2007, 2009, and 2010.

Mercado played collegiate baseball for Roger Bidwell and former Yarmouth-Dennis and current UConn assistant coach Chris Podezwa at UConn-Avery Point. He was a member of the NJCAA New England District Champions and NJCAA Region XXI Champions in 1999 and 2000. He won a Northeast Region Championship and earned a trip to the NJCAA World Series in 1999. The following year, Mercado garnered All-New England laurels. He later started in center field at Fitchburg State University and was named Male Student-Athlete of the Year in 2002.

He has been the Dean of Students at New Britain High School since 2004 and resides in New Britain.

CHRISTIAN WONDERS



Position: Pitching Coach Experience: 2nd season Alma Mater: Georgia College & State Univ

Christian Wonders serves as the PitchingCoordinator for Cressey Sports Performance-Massachusetts, where he operates his own business, Elite Pitching Development. Christian started as a client at CSP and eventually went on to intern and coach out of both the MA and FL facilities. He

played collegiate baseball at Georgia College & State University where he received his B.S. in Exercise Science, and now provides pitching consulting services for programs around New England at the high school, collegiate, and professional levels. Christian also retains a C.S.C.S. certification through the National Strength and Conditioning Association, in order to bridge the gap between performance and skills training.



SCOTT PICKLER INDUCTED INTO AMERICAN BASEBALL COACHES HALL OF FAME

The American Baseball Coaches Association inducted seven new members into the ABCA Hall of Fame at the 2019 ABCA Convention, including legendary Cypress College baseball coach Scott Pickler. The Hall of Fame Class of 2019 was honored in front of their families, friends and coaching peers at the ABCA/Diamond Hall of Fame Banquet on Friday, January 4 in Dallas. Induction to the ABCA Hall of Fame is the highest honor

Induction to the ABCA Hall of Fame is the highest honor bestowed by the organization. The ABCA was founded in 1945 and the Hall of Fame began in 1966.

Scott Pickler won nearly 1,000 games and collected five state championships as head coach at Cypress College, won six Cape Cod League championships as coach of the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox and has coached more than 100 players who went on to play in Major League Baseball.

One of the most respected community college coaches in the nation, Pickler completed his 35th season with Cypress College baseball in 2018, in the second year of his role as Head Coach Emeritus. He led the Chargers to state championships in 1991, 1994, 1997, 2003 and 2013, four runner-up finishes and 11 semifinal appearances. He has been selected California Community Colleges Coach of the Year four times. Pickler's student-athletes have received scholarships at four-year schools 340 times, and more than 126 players have been selected in the Major League Draft. Twenty of Pickler's former Chargers have played in the Majors. Pickler has spent 21 seasons as a coach in the Cape Cod Summer League, where 96 of his former players have gone on to play in Major League Baseball. He led the Yar-

mouth-Dennis Red Sox to league championships in 2004, 2006, 2007, 2014, 2015 and 2016. He also served as a coach for the 1995 USA Baseball National Trials.

Prior to Cypress, Pickler coached for six seasons at Savanna and Loara High Schools. He posted a combined record of 123-36 (.774) and won the CIF championship with his 1983 Loara squad.

Pickler is a 1968 graduate of Savanna High School and was inducted to the school's Hall of Fame in 2016. He was then inducted into the Cypress College Athletics Hall of Fame in 2017, before joining the 2019 ABCA Hall of Fame Class.












CLINICS
