

Game-Worn Jerseys/Memorabilia

The Whitecaps will sell game-used jerseys to generate revenue for the club. Most will be sold as generic items, from the souvenir operation (or some equivalent outlet). Those jerseys whose value increases after being taken out of regular use will be identified, authenticated, professionally assessed, and sold by some appropriate process overseen by the Vice President for Finance.

To prepare for authentication, the General Manager will maintain a record of which players wore which jerseys. This record will be both written and photographic, and turned over to the VP for Finance when a jersey is taken out of game use. To allow for sufficient time to elapse to determine a jersey's eventual value, some or all may be held out of sales transactions for three or more years, on the recommendation of either the GM or VP.

When there is reason to believe a jersey has greater than normal value, the details will be reviewed with a memorabilia specialist, and a value placed on the jersey. It may then be sold in whatever fashion the VP for Finance determines appropriate, after the Board reviews the intended process.
