 One of the most respected veteran community college coaches in the nation, Scott Pickler has been at the helm of the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox since 1998. Pickler has enjoyed considerable success both within the Cape Cod Baseball

League and at Cypress College, leading Y-D to six Cape League Championships (2004, 2006, 2007, 2014, 2015, 2016) and runner-up finishes in two others, along with five regular season East Division crowns. Coach Pickler became the Cape Cod Baseball League's all-time leader in managerial wins during the 2022 season.

He attended Cypress College and earned All-Conference recognition under Coach Larry Mercadante, later earning a degree in physical education from San Diego State University. During his time at SDSU, Pickler also played second base for the Aztecs.

Pickler and his wife, Sharon, have two children, Jeff and Kari. Kari is the mother of Scott's two grandchildren. Jeff was an All-Conference choice for his father at Cypress in 1995 and then went on to be an All-American and Academic All-American at the University of Tennessee. Kari is a graduate of UCLA and was a Bruins Song Leader. She has performed on Broadway in the musical "Big", is the owner of The E-Factor, and is the mother of Scott's first grandchild. Pickler's brother, Brad, is the head coach of the softball team at Cypress and has led the Chargers to eight state championships.

Craig is a wonderful addition to the Y-D Red Sox Coaching Staff and is back in his 2nd year in Coach Pickler's dugout. He brings a wealth of knowledge about the game of baseball and the process it takes to become a champion. With years of experience, Coach Gianinno brings a unique perspective to the Red Sox that players and staff can turn to for guidance. Coach

Gianinno's resume as a mentor and coach is of great value to the Y-D Red Sox, providing both players and staff with a unique point of view when competing.

Craig Gianinno is a native from San Francisco, where he attended Sacred Heart Cathedral. Gianinno played collegiately at CCSF. He was named the team's most valuable player and earned all-conference honors. He later transferred to the College of Marin, where he played for ABCA Hall of Fame Baseball Coach Al Endriss. Gianinno was selected to the Northern California All Star Team. He earned all-conference honors and led the Mariners to the California State Playoffs. Gianinno completed his collegiate career at Bellevue University, (NE) culminating as a member of the 1995 College World Series National Championship Team which was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2018. Gianinno was nominated by his teammates to deliver the induction speech.

Craig and his wife Bonnie reside in Sparta, NJ with their twin daughters, Eliana and Sophia.

Cam is the primary hitting coach at Vanguard, responsible for developing the team's hitting programs throughout the season while also functioning as the teams infield coach. He played four years at Holy Names University where he graduated with his bachelor's degree in Communications. Cameron started his coaching career during the summer of 2020 in the South Florida Collegiate League. He was an assistant for the West Boca Snappers working with the infielders and hitters. Cameron has spent the last two seasons at California Baptist University as the graduate assistant, where he is earning his master's degree in Sport & Performance Psychology. At CBU Cameron primarily works with analytics to help maximize player performance and was the first base coach during the Lancers 2021 WAC regular season championship season.

Scott “Pick” Pickler took over the reins of the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in 1998 and has been a crucial part of our success ever since. This season marks his 25th with the club, the longest tenure of any active manager in the Cape Cod Baseball League. He also holds the all-time record for wins by any CCBL manager.

Pick has the most playoff appearances, highest playoff winning percentage and most championships for a single team in league history. And he has recruited and coached scores of players who became Major League Baseball stars – including a Rookie of the Year, MVP, Batting Champions, Cy Young Award winners and World Series Champions.

Look for his #13 Y-D jersey in the third base coach’s box at every game.

Elijah Ontiveros began his coaching career at Westmont College, right after graduating from UC Davis in 2017. Entering his sixth season with the Warrior program, and his first with Coach LaTorre at the helm, Elijah has been tasked with working with the catchers and hitters and leading the program’s recruiting efforts. In addition to his duties as an assistant coach, he also works as Westmont’s athletic facilities liaison.

In his five years on staff, Ontiveros has led Westmont to four NAIA Opening Round Tournament appearances. As the catching coach, he has coached 4 All-Conference catchers, 2 Gold Glove award winners, and an NAIA All-American. He oversaw the development of Simon Reid from 2020-2022, until he was drafted as a junior in the 10th round of the MLB Draft by the Los Angeles Dodgers. Reid was the only NAIA position player selected.

Ontiveros has also assisted in leading 4 top-15 program ranking offenses during his time. The offenses that Ontiveros has coached rank in the top-15 for Average, Slugging, On-Base Percentage, Runs Scored, Hits, Doubles, Homeruns and Runs Batted In.

During Ontiveros time with the Warriors, they have been ranked as high as #3 in the NAIA Coaches’ Poll, their highest ranking in program history, before hosting an NAIA Opening Round Tournament that same year.

Ontiveros is currently pursuing a Master Degree in Kinesiology at California State University, Northridge, specializing in biomechanics.

Allen Hancock, Frapart has been a baseball coach for 6 years Trosky Baseball Program and coached Summer Baseball in the Western Baseball Association for AV Select and 4 years for the Ventura County Pirates in the Golden Coast Collegiate Summer League.

Frapart played an integral role on the coaching staff in 2021 that led the Bulldogs to a conference-best win percentage of .813 winning percentage, an overall record of 18-6 (13-3 WSC), and a No. 5 ranking in the CCCSIA poll while battling through an ever-changing shortened season.

Frapart is a Certified Strength and Conditioning Coach through the National Strength and Conditioning Association. He also holds a Master of Education degree from the University of Antelope Valley and a Bachelor of Exercise Science degree from Florida Atlantic University. Prior to joining the collegiate coaching ranks, Frapart assisted in training several professional baseball and football players, including Le’Veon Bell, Miguel Cabrera, and JD Martinez while working for Bomarito Performance Systems in Miami, Florida.

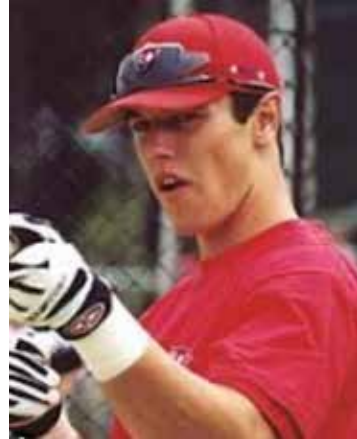

Wes Whisler was Mr. Baseball in Indiana in 2001. He later attended UCLA and played for the Y-D Red Sox in 2002 and 2003. In his first year with Y-D he was named the league's Top Pro Prospect. In

2004, he was drafted by the Chicago White Sox. Wes recently reminisced on his time on the Cape. "I had a great time playing for Y-D with a great group of players who all got along and loved to joke around. I went to the beach and did sightseeing. I loved the atmosphere on the Cape and the fans were always in the game," he recalled. Wes has fond memories of his host family, Marty and Jane. "They didn't miss a game. Always had great meals for me after the game. One family member worked for the Kennedy compound and there were many great stories shared." When he finally made the major leagues, Wes was thrilled. "Playing in the MLB was everything I thought it would be and more! I will never forget my debut for the White Sox on June 2, 2009. The feeling of running out on the field for the first time in a big-league uniform in front of 30,000 plus fans. That day I got my first big league strike out facing Matt Holliday." Wes no longer plays in the majors, but he runs baseball and softball facilities and coaches youth travel teams. But his memories of playing in the Cape Cod Baseball League will never die.



DENNIS NEAGLE

Denny Neagle had a long MLB career. But he still has vivid memories of playing for the Y-D Red Sox. He enjoyed the Cape Cod experience. "I lived with a host family was related to the person that ran the Y-D Red Sox at the

time. I remember going to see "Who Framed Roger Rabbit?" with the whole family. I went to the beach and enjoyed just checking the whole area out while I was there. I grew up in Annapolis, so the Cape Cod area reminded me of home really." Denny recalls that the 1988 squad, led by Don Reed, was very talented. "I just remember how much talent there was that summer in 1988 and how good the competition was to face. So, I figured if I could have success against the guys that were there that summer, then it should boost my confidence. That's exactly what it did for me, and I used that experience to help further me along going into my junior year of college and it helped me make 1st team All-Big Ten and get drafted in the 3rd round." Denny's experience on the Cape led to some great things. "I ended up having close to a 14-year career in MLB playing for the Twins, Pirates, Braves, Reds, Yankees, and Rockies. I would say two of my best highlights would be throwing a 4-hit shutout in game 4 of the NLCS with the Braves in 1997 when we were down 2 games to 1 and winning the World Series with the Yankees in 2000 with all my family there to celebrate it with me."

CAPE COD BASEBALL LEAGUE CELEBRATES 100 YEARS

Baseball on Cape Cod traces its roots to 1885, when teams from different towns played at agricultural fairs and other town events. Contests were suspended when WWI began and many available players joined the service. The Cape Cod Baseball League (CCBL) as we know it today was

officially crowned in 1923 with four charter teams: Falmouth, Osterville, Hyannis and Chatham. Falmouth won the first CCBL championship. Rosters included local and regional college players. After suspending competition during WWII, play resumed in 1946 when the GIs returned. That same

year, the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox franchise joined the league as the "Yarmouth Indians." Thereafter, many teams came and went. In 1963 the CCBL was officially sanctioned by the NCAA and became a preferred destination for players hoping to attract the attention of MLB scouts. The playoffs were restructured to include Upper Cape and Lower Cape Division winners. In 1967, our franchise became the "Yarmouth Red Sox." In 1988 expansion brought the total to ten teams. The West Division includes Falmouth, Wareham, Bourne, Cotuit and Hyannis. The East Division includes Yarmouth-Dennis, Harwich, Brewster, Orleans and Chatham. In 1985 the Cape League switched from metal to wood bats to give players aspiring to make it to the MLB the chance to experience big league playing conditions. This was well-received by players and coaches alike and Cape Cod became the best place to play summer college baseball. Indeed, Major League Baseball officially named the CCBL the premier amateur summer league in the United States. In the 38 seasons of the wood bat era the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox have won the most championships (8). Today, there is little doubt as to the CCBL's place among the dozens of college summer leagues. Approximately one of every four MLB players played summer ball on the Cape, including World Series Champions, MVPs, Batting Champions, Home Run Champions, Cy Young Award winners, Rookies of the Year and many noteworthy stars. In the 2023 World Baseball Classic where multiple national teams competed there were 69 former CCBL players rostered. Like the slogan says, the Cape Cod Baseball League is where the stars of tomorrow shine tonight!

INF/MGR BOBBY VALENTINE

Yarmouth 1967. Played 10 seasons in MLB. 16 seasons as MLB manager. Ejected from a game as Mets manager and returned to dugout in a Groucho Marx disguise.

1B STEVE BALBONI

YD 1977. CCBL MVP. Led the league in homers and RBI. Played in the 1977 Championship Series. 11 seasons in MLB. Hit .320 for 1985 World Series Champion Royals.

1B MARK SWEENEY

Played for Y-D Championship teams in 1989 and 1990. Named CCBL Playoffs MVP in 1989. Won CCBL Sportsmanship Award 1990. 14 years in MLB. Holds the all-time MLB record for pinch-hit RBIs. CCBL HoF 2018.

2B CRAIG BIGGIO

Y-D 1986. 20 years in MLB, all with the Astros. 7-time All-Star, 4-time Gold Glove winner, 5-time Silver Slugger (only MLB player awarded at two positions-C and 2B). Inducted into CCBL Hall of Fame and Cooperstown Hall of Fame.

SS MIKE BORDICK

Played on 1986 Y-D team with Craig Biggio. 14 years in MLB. Played in 1990 and 2000 World Series. Succeeded Cal Ripken as Orioles SS. Funded construction of dugouts at Red Wilson Field.

3B JOE PANIK

Y-D 2010 CCBL All-Star. Played in 2010 CCBL Championship Series. 10 years in MLB, including 2014 Giants World Series Champs. Won 2016 NL Gold Glove. Had a fun name to announce.

LF ANDREW STEVENSON

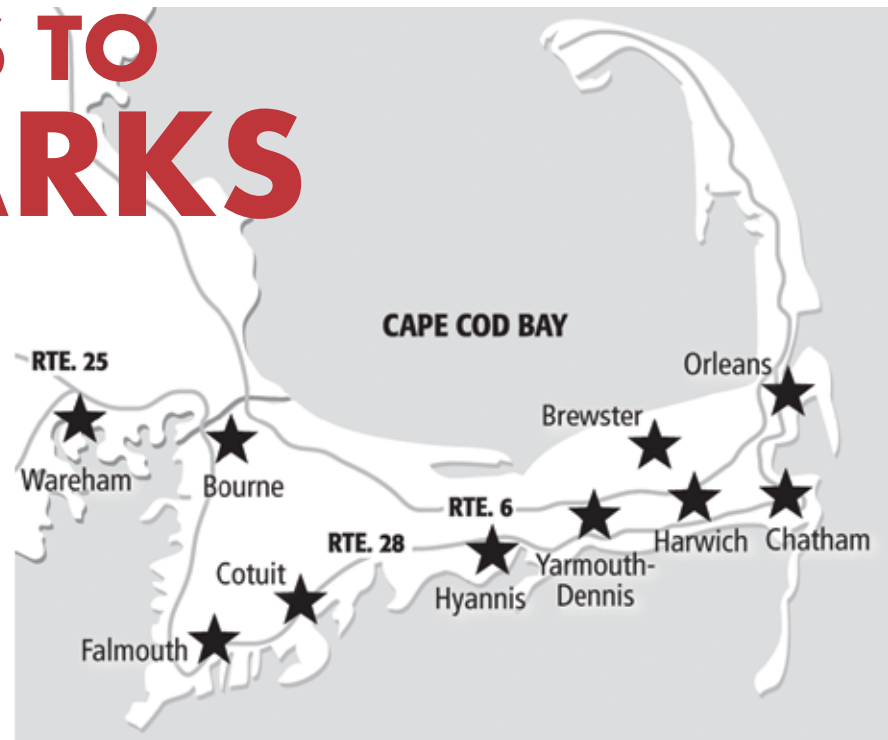
