#### **BE A GOOD FAN!**

The Orleans Firebirds are committed to creating and maintaining a safe, comfortable, and family-friendly sports and entertainment experience at Eldredge Park in Orleans.

The following guidelines have been established regarding fan

#### Fan Interference

The Orleans Firebirds make every effort to ensure socially acceptable behavior in order to allow fans to enjoy the game in comfort. We have strict guidelines regarding fan behavior that directly or indirectly interferes with the enjoyment of the game. The Orleans Firebirds do not condone misbehavior of any kind and are prepared to address those that violate our policies with expulsion from Eldredge Park.

Cape Cod Baseball League rules require that fans not go onto the field, throw objects onto the field or interfere with balls in play. This includes loud disruptive comments, inanimate noises, use of electronic devices to distract players or coaches and/or any other method that causes a distraction to the field of play. Violation may result in immediate removal from the Eldredge Park and/or arrest and prosecution.

Profanity, abusive language, or conduct deemed disorderly by The Orleans Firebirds may result in referral to local law enforcement.

#### Abusive Fan Behavior - Use of Derogatory Language

The Orleans Firebirds organization does not tolerate the use of offensive language concerning another person's race, ethnicity, gender, religion, disability, age, sexual orientation or national origin by any fan, whether such language is directed at players, umpires, Orleans Firebirds personnel, or other fans. Such behavior may be reported to the announcer's booth or by contacting the Orleans Police Department.

#### FAN CODE OF CONDUCT

The Orleans Firebirds ask that all fans make themselves aware of the following fan code of conduct.

- Be courteous to other fans. Do not disrupt other fans with disrespectful, unruly, or hostile actions or behavior. Inappropriate behavior should be reported to the nearest Orleans Firebirds personnel or by contacting the Orleans Police Department.
- Do not go onto the field, throw objects onto the field or interfere with balls in play.
- Be courteous to the residents of the neighborhoods surrounding Eldredge Park when entering and exiting.
- At no time should fans attempt to cross route 28 to retrieve foul balls.
- Please do not consume alcoholic beverages at Eldredge Park, and/or in the parking lots before, during or after a game.
- Should The Orleans Firebirds suspect that an individual may be impaired by, or under the influence of alcohol or a controlled substance, The Orleans Firebirds will contact the Orleans Police Department.
- Under Massachusetts General Law, Eldredge Park prohibits the use
  of electronic cigarettes (vapes) and smokeless tobacco as well as
  the possession and/or use of marijuana on the premises including
  electronic THC delivery systems.
- Foul/abusive language and obscene gestures are prohibited and may result in the removal from Eldredge Park.
- No signs or banners deemed inappropriate by the Orleans Firebirds will be allowed.
- All persons attending a game at Eldredge Park will be expected to abide by all applicable federal, state and local laws.

#### Pet Policy

 Well-behaved, leashed pets who are under the control of their owners at all times are welcome at Firebirds games.

## Our ORLEANS LEGENDS

For our cover story this year, we asked Head Coach Kelly Nicholson and a group of former Birds coaches and managers to select some Orleans players who were particularly impactful, both in their time in the CCBL and beyond in pro ball. Our panel:

Kelly Nicholson, current field manager since 2005 and also the pitching coach from 2001-2004;

Carmen Carcone, field manager from 2002-2004 and also an assistant in 1998-1999, now a scout for the San Francisco Giants:

Don Norris, an assistant coach for late former field manager Rolando Casanova, succeeded him as field manager from 1997-2001, now a scout for the Toronto Blue Jays;

Jon Bunnell, Nauset grad, former bullpen

catcher and longtime assistant coach, now a scouting supervisor for the Atlanta Braves;

John Castleberry, first an assistant for late former field manager and Nauset legend Jack Donahue, then field manager from 1984-1991. After retiring from scouting, most recently as a national crosschecker for the Giants, he's now the CCBL Commissioner.

A lot of names came up in the discussion, probably enough for several covers and stories. Here's the first group of legends:

Frank Thomas of Auburn played for Orleans in 1988. With the Chicago White Sox, he was a five-time All Star, two-time AL MVP, four-time Silver Slugger Award winner, and

AL Batting Champion (1997). He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2000, and the National Baseball Hall of Fame

John C: It's the best story of his time here. Frank was tight with Bo Jackson, and the White Sox were playing a day game up in Boston. We were at Wareham that day, and he said, hey, can I go up there and see Bo? And I said, yeah, go ahead. Meet us in Wareham. So, Bo gives him two bats. Okay, now, this guy only hit 5 or 6 home runs all year. In this game at Wareham, he hit three home runs with Bo's bats, and

Wareham, where they had those football stands. And he hit it not over the stands, but to the right of the stands up in the upper deck. He hit one in left field and then one in right field. And I remember to this day looking at my assistant coach and saying, we're going to ride this big guy all the way to the championship. And sure enough, we got into the championship round, but Frank had already left the team. We had the tying run at second base, and my shortstop from George Washington University was up, and he was hitting about .210. And I just looked at that SOB, I mean, I was so pissed.

one of them was in left center at

During the all-star game that year, Frank hit a triple. Besides playing baseball, he was a tight end at Auburn, he could fly. I mean, he could flat-out run. And he'd always complain



about his ankles hurting him. But there were about 10,000 people there in Orleans, the largest crowd I've ever seen there. It was packed. And he turned on the jets and he was flying, and I went, ankles, my ass. But he could play.

Todd Helton of Tennessee played for the Cardinals in 1984. With the Colorado Rockies, he was a five-time All Star, a three-time Gold Glove Award winner, a four-time Silver Slugger Award winner, and MLB Batting Champion and RBI Leader (2000). He was inducted into both Cooperstown and the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2024.

Jon B: I'm sure Todd would have made Team USA, but I know he wanted the Cape experience with the wood. With Todd, it was part of the process. Back then, nobody used the wood when they were younger. And it's part of the process of becoming a great hitter. So, Todd came to the Cape. I don't believe he hit a home run in a game that year. Hit for average. But his job that summer was to use the middle of the field, use the gaps and square the ball up. And he wasn't worried about hitting home runs. And I think that was all about, he's got a plan. He stuck with it and you can see where it went. But we put him in the home run derby at the All-Star Game and he won it.

John C: Well, from a scouting side, here's the deal, just to add to JB. Everything he said is right. He didn't hit a home run that year, but in the home run derby, he was hitting bombs. The concern was would he have any power – raw power does mean something, when you know he can hit already, because you know what's in there. So, he's hitting these home runs, and we all looked at each other, and I don't remember specifically who I was next to, but he said, I don't think we have to worry about the power. It's going to come. And sure enough, the guy could always hit, and as coaches and scouts know, power's the last thing to come a lot of times and teaching a kid to hit is hard. Todd showcased that in

the home run hitting contest and I think that helped relieve some of the scouts' minds, pro people that were looking at him at that time. There was a like a sigh like, okay, it's in there.

#### Nomar Garciaparra of

Georgia Tech played for the Cardinals championship team in 1993. Though he played for three other teams, he's best remembered locally as the legendary shortstop for the Boston Red Sox. He was a six-time All Star, two-time AL batting champion, the AL Rookie of the Year and Silver Slugger Award winner (1997). He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2002, and the Boston Red Sox Hall of Fame in 2014.

Jon B: Rolando Casanova loved him. We all did. One story I could tell you, I remember it was early in the year, and he wasn't here yet. He was with Team USA or some other travel team that played out of the country, and he flew back to the States and came right to the Cape. Nomar called us and Cas said, Jonny, can you give him some directions to the field? So I gave Nomar some directions, and I said, you'll probably be there right at game time, and I got off the phone with him and Cas says, "get his uniform ready." I'm like, well, he's been traveling all day and the last couple of days, and then he has to find his way here to the field in the Cape. And Cas says, let me tell you, Jonny, with the uniform ready when he gets here, he's going to want to play. So, he arrives right before game time. I think we were at Harwich. He got his uniform on real quick and jumped right in the game in the first inning. He got a hit his first at bat and smoked a ball in the gap, it was either a double or triple. In the bottom half of the inning, the first ball hit is in the

unbelievable backhand play. He ball was hit near shortstop, it was jumps up in the air and throws it an out, it was like money in the to first. And we were all like, this is it, wow. That was awesome. And I remember Greg LaRocca, who's a very good player – I think he made the big leagues as well - he was our other shortstop. He was a utility, played second, short, and we all looked over at him. He was bending over and picking splinters out of his backside. He saw that play. I thought that was the funniest thing ever. But Cas knew right away. He's like, you won't keep this guy off the field. He's going to want to play. But yeah, like John said, he played

hard every single day. His work

ethic was outstanding. Great guy.

And all the pitchers on that team

will tell you, as soon as the

bank right there on the ground ball. All the pitchers had so much confidence in him and anything hit near him, it was going to be an out. And that was that was key. So yeah, that was El Gato, The Cat. Lance Niekro of Florida Southern played for the Cardinals

in 1999 and 2000. In 1999, he came within a few decimal points of the triple crown (which no one has ever won) on his way to the CCBL MVP title. In his pro career, he played primarily for the San Francisco Giants. He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Game in 2006.

**Don:** The most interesting story about Niekro is that he was signed to go to the Northwoods

we had to fight to get him. In the end, [Commissioner] Bob Stead had to basically tell the Northwoods League president to go take a hike, and we're going to take the kid. And he won the MVP of the league title. Another story I remember was, we're in Brewster and I'm trying to have him bunt in the eighth inning with guys first and second, and he can't bunt worth a crap. And he gets two strikes and then he hits a three-run homer to win the game. I'm like, okay, he's not bunting any more this year. So, you know, hopefully I learned my lesson there. I think Lance was also the first guy back in those days who didn't work. That was when everybody used to work and Lance didn't. He's like, I don't need a job. And he went fishing every day and showed up to the park. He was pretty much already a real big leaguer, you know? That's how he acted. He'd been around it all his life. And he was easy, you know, played

really easy. Didn't play with any anxiety. And, that's how you're supposed to play in the summer.

Then there was the 18-inning game at Wareham early in the 2000 season. Lance came up at the beginning because the draft had happened and he was holding out a little bit. He probably shouldn't have even been up there playing, and he definitely shouldn't have been on the mound pitching. But we had gone through every pitcher on the staff, except for the guy who started the day before and the guy who started the day after. And Lance said, hey, I can go out and throw my knuckleball. I said, no way. And then finally I yelled at Jonny and said, can you go and

see if he can at least get it across the plate? And he said, yeah, he can get it across the plate. I said, okay. So we sent him out there for the bottom of the 18th, and he got a couple of outs, and he had the game

winning RBI as well. The Cape Cod Times headline the next day said, "Wareham tops Orleans in 18!" I'm still pissed about that. I still have that somewhere in my files.

Matt Wieters of Georgia Tech played for the Cardinals in 2006, winning the CCBL Top Pro Prospect Award. Most of his pro career was spent with the Baltimore Orioles. He was a four-time All Star, and two-time Gold Glove Award winner. He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2013.

**Kelly:** He made the game

look so easy. Switch hitter. He was also a closer, but he didn't pitch when he was here. And I think I said more to him when he was inducted into the Cape League Hall of Fame that day than I said to him all during his summer here, he was a super quiet kid. That's the truth, but a really nice conversation at the Hall of Fame thing. And man, he was super quiet. Yeah. Super. The one story I remember about Matt – we also had Andrew Brackman on the team that year, and Scott Boras represented both of those guys, and he was around on the Cape that summer. And I was like, damn. I remember making a mound visit one night with Brack and Matt and I came back and I said, man, that that was an expensive mound visit. Their signing bonuses were, you know, back in whatever year that was, they were big. They were both first rounders.

Kolten Wong of Hawai'i played for the Firebirds in 2010, easily winning the CCBL MVP award. He spent most of his pro career with the St. Louis Cardinals, and was a two-time Gold Glove Award winner. He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2016.

Kelly: Well, the thing I remember about K-Wong is something that Mike Roberts [Cotuit manager] told me, just how he could dominate a game on both sides of the ball, whether it

was defensively or offensively, and steal bases and play great D and hit singles and bunt and hit homers. He could just control the game. I remember Mike telling me that. K-Wong was already at a different level when he was here.

Marcus Stroman of Duke played for the Firebirds in 2010 and again in 2011 for part of the season. His ERA for both years was 0.00. In his pro career, he's played for the Blue Jays, Cubs, Mets and Yankees. He's a two-time All Star, a Gold Glove Award winner, and he was a member of the All-World Baseball Classic, winning the MVP award. He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2022.

Kelly: Stroman had a little bit different personality from Matt Wieters! But I love Stro. I loved Stro on the Cape. You know, I loved him. I love Marcus Stroman, and his younger brother's on our roster next summer. He joked about his 0.00 ERA in his Hall of Fame speech, he said, maybe I should have given up one run. I would have gotten in the Hall of Fame sooner. We couldn't figure out what was taking so damn long, right? So, he got up there and says, maybe I should have given up one run. What made him different on the mound was he had strikes. He threw strikes. He had stuff and he had cojones. It was a little swag with Stro all the time, because he was five foot seven and everybody thought he was too small. So, between a 5-7 guy that hasn't given up a run and a 6-5 projectable guy that just got shelled, I'll take Stro. And \$100 million later, Stroh's done. He's all right.

Mitchell Jordan of Stetson, who won the B.F.C. Whitehouse Award for the league's best pitcher, tied the record for the all-time ERA with .021. Professionally, he spent four years in Oakland's minor league system, reaching AA. He was inducted into the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2023.

**Kelly:** He had simply the finest summer of any starting pitcher since I've been in Orleans.

## MORE ORLEANS NOTABLES

**Jeff Conine** of UCLA played for the 1986 championship team. Though he played for several teams in his pro career, he was known as Mr. Marlin. He was a two-time All Star and played on two World Series championship teams (1997, 2003). A left fielder and first baseman in his pro career, he was a pitcher in Orleans.

**John C:** Conine pitched for me, for God's sake. He didn't even hit. That's how good a manager I was. He'd take BP, and the other coaches kept saying, hey, you want to go out and watch him? Nah, he's a pitcher. All pitchers think they can hit. If I had just run out there and looked at the SOB, I'd be a genius.

Gary Alexander of Arizona played for the 1986 championship team. At Arizona, he was a two-way player and was the winning pitcher when they won the College World Series. Professionally, he played for minor league teams in the Texas and Philadelphia systems, reaching AAA.

**John C:** Gary Alexander hit 16 home runs with the wood bat – four straight in the playoffs. He's not a name recognition guy, but he'll probably get in the CCBL Hall of Fame.

J.T. Snow of Arizona played for Orleans in 1988 at first base along with Frank Thomas. He spent most of his professional career with the Giants, and won the Gold Glove Award six years in a row (1995-2000).

**John C:** Frank didn't like using the leather at all, and I'd work with him on infield play. I told him, I've got a guy playing first base, and he's probably going to win five Gold Gloves, and he won more than that. Best

first baseman I've ever seen, saved so many runs. Not even close. A real quality person. Great person, in fact.

Aaron Boone of USC played third base for the 1993 championship team. He played for several teams in his professional career, and was an All Star with the Yankees in 2003 when he broke the hearts of Red Sox Nation. He's managed the Yankees since 2018.

**Jon B:** Every time we had a runner on second base it seemed like Aaron Boone scored him. He's a clutch hitter. Just one of those guys. You knew he was going to get the guy in. He led the league in RBI.

Jay Payton of Georgia Tech played for Orleans in 1992 and 1993 as an outfielder. He was Nomar's roommate and a teammate of Jason Varitek at GT. He had a major league career with several teams from 1998-2010.

**Jon B:** Jay was here two summers in a row, and he often struggled at the plate, but battled on and won the Harry Hossfeld Spirit Award. Great guy, playoff hero, hit a screaming missile home run five feet off the ground to get us into the playoffs.

Mark Teixeira of Georgia Tech played for Orleans in 1999 when he was a freshman and won the CCBL Top Pro Prospect award. He played first and third along with Lance, swapping positions each game. During his pro career, mostly with the Yankees, he collected a lot of awards:

- 3× All Star (2005, 2009, 2015)
- World Series champion (2009)
- 5× Gold Glove Award (2005, 2006, 2009, 2010, 2012)
- 3× Silver Slugger Award (2004, 2005, 2009)
- AL home run leader (2009)
- AL RBI leader (2009)

His work ethic was unparalleled, and he handled his success with an incredible amount of grace and humility. It was an absolute honor and privilege to have Mitchell on our team in 2015.

Emmanuel "Manny" Burriss of Kent State played for the championship 2005 Cardinals. He holds the team record for stolen bases (36), was named a league All Star and the co-Most Valuable Player (MVP) of the playoffs. In his pro career he played primarily for the Giants. He was responsible for an epic moment in team history in Game 1 of the 2005 championship, as described in our 2015 yearbook:

A scoreless tie entering the home half of the 9th, Burriss ("our table-setter, our sparkplug all year," said Nicholson) walked to lead off the inning. After Jacobs flied out, Reynolds was relieved by Romas Hicks (Georgia State: led league with 23 appearances), who ironically pitched for Orleans in 2004. Hicks promptly walked Uribes, then uncorked a wild pitch to move Burriss just 90 feet from home plate. After Curtis was intentionally walked to load the bases, Pill hit a high fly in foul territory, near the first base dugout. Burriss, determined to score, tagged up and blazed home. Hicks, to end his disastrous outing, failed to cover home plate. When asked about the play, 3rd base coach Robb Gorr said he simply sat back and "choked on the smoke" while watching Burriss score the winning run.





#### **2024 CCBL SEASON REVIEW**

The Firebirds scrapped and fought their way to a playoff berth in 2024, losing several close games and finishing with a 15-25-0 record which was not a true reflection of the team's overall performance and talent. Over the course of the season, 48 players came and went on the roster; but each one integrated seamlessly into the team and everyone maintained a tough, competitive attitude until the end when Y-D won the first playoff round. East Division rival Harwich followed a similar trajectory, battling to a playoff spot, before finally going on a tear through the

opposition, beating Bourne in Game 3 of the finals for their first championship in 13 years.

Orleans was represented on the East All Stars by 1B Jack Gurevitch (San Diego), OF Ben Zeigler-Namoa (Hawai'i), UT Hudson Shupe (Gonzaga), RHP Callan Fang (Harvard), RHP Cody Bowker (GWU/Vanderbilt), and RHP Itsuki Takemoto (Hawai'i). Zeigler-Namoa, Fang and Takemoto were named to the Final All-League team, and Takemoto handily won the league's B.F.C. Whitehouse Outstanding Pitcher Award with a 3-1 record, 0.71 ERA, 0.75 WHIP, and .138 BAA.

The 2024 MLB First Year Player Draft in July saw 20 Firebirds selected. Of the 20, 14 went in the first 10 rounds, including back-to-back third round selections Khadim Diaw (2024, Loyola Marymount, Minnesota Twins, 96th overall) and Austin Overn (2023, USC, Baltimore Orioles, 97th overall). Nine alumni made their MLB debuts, including 2023 first rounder Jacob Wilson (Grand Canyon/Oakland), 2022 first rounder Jace Jung (Texas Tech/Detroit), and 2022 second rounder Tyler Locklear (Virginia Commonwealth/Seattle).

## Firebird Volunteers the 50-50 Team

Local resident volunteers are the lifeblood of the Firebirds. Many residents open their homes to house Firebird players and interns during the season. Other volunteers prepare the Orleans Firebirds yearbook, which is available free-of-charge at the welcome tables behind home plate and near left and right field foul poles. The "Bird Feeders" coordinate and serve post-game meals to the players. Local businesses provide financial support by purchasing advertising in the yearbook and on the banners hanging along the outfield fence.

Some of the most important

volunteers manage the 50/50 raffle at Firebirds home games. Over the last twenty years, the raffle has contributed more than \$250,000 to the Firebirds' operating budget. These volunteers begin their work before the snow melts, tearing massive rolls containing 200,000 raffle tickets into convenient strips of ten or twenty tickets for sale at Firebirds games. These strips are sold by other volunteers who roam the hill and the fences and sell the tickets during home games. (Listen for shouts of "You've got to be in it to win it!") During the later innings, other volunteers separate the individual tickets for the prize drawing. Many of the volunteers remember the 2023 playoff game when they sold more than 7000 raffle tickets, and all worked together to have the tickets separated in time for the prize drawing during the eighth inning. One lucky winner walked away with over \$3500 that night!

Since 2003, Tom and Bonnie Lincoln have led the 50/50 raffle team, leaving their day jobs (Bonnie works as an intensive care nurse and Tom serves as a harbormaster) in time to coordinate the raffle volunteers before the first pitch. Sheila and Tam Garran, who have attended Firebirds games for decades, were drafted by the Lincolns several years ago to help manage the raffle. Rick Marvin (who also recruits the kids' chorus

which sings "Take Me Out to the Ballgame" during the Seventh Inning Stretch) joined the team twenty years ago. Amongst others, Lisa Radke, Arlene Bennett, Jim Possehl, Rosemary Quantik, and Woody and Catherine Turncliffe have been regular volunteers more recently, bringing more energy and smiles to the group.

The Firebirds and the 50/50raffle have become a summertime tradition for the Lincolns and the Garrans. The Lincolns enjoy people-watching at Eldredge Park from their table behind the Firebirds dugout and bantering with fans during games - many of whom have become friends they reconnect with summer after summer. 


In my younger days, Dad would let me run with the kids in the chase for the foul balls hit our way over the net. You should have seen me, in full stride.

Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome back Coach Nicholson for his 24th summer and 20th as manager, the longest tenured Orleans skipper in the "modern era" (1963-present). Kelly (Coach K, or Coach Nick) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholar-athlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letter winner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University.

After earning his Bachelor's degree in Business Administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master's degree in Education from LMU. He was the head coach of the Loyola HS Cubs for 11 seasons, leading the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount's pitching coach; each year the Lions won the West Coast Conference title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K's staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37 ERA. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 strikeouts in 401 innings pitched.


Co-winner of the Hossfeld Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became the field manager in 2005. In his first season, Nicholson was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach Nick was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2). In 2015, Kelly led the Firebirds to a franchise record of 31-12-1 (.716) and was again named the Manager of the Year. In 2017, his Birds captured the President's Trophy once more (29-15), and he received his fourth Mike Curran Award.

In 2019, the Birds shared the regular season East title with Chatham and Kelly attained his 350th win. In 2021, the team commemorated his 20th anniversary with a surprise on-field celebration. In 2023, Coach Nick notched his 400th win, and the Birds made a thrilling run at the CCBL championship before losing in the third and final game. Under his leadership, Orleans has captured six Eastern Division titles

Under his leadership, Orleans has captured six Eastern Division titles and is a perennial playoff contender. Since his arrival in 2001, 32 former players have been selected in the first-round of the MLB draft and 130 former Orleans Cardinals/Firebirds have reached MLB.

It's no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league, and in the wider baseball community. His annual reunion dinners for players and coaches in Scottsdale during MLB Spring Training are legendary. He's a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they'll see a first-class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his 24th summer.

Jay played baseball at Foothill College (CA) and in Europe semi-professionally, and has coached at various levels since 2007.



#### Jim Lawler

Pitchina Coach Hometown: College Station, TX With more than three decades of coaching experience, Coach Lawler brings an impeccable baseball pedigree to the Firebirds. His resume includes six years as the pitching coach for the Wareham Gatemen (2014-2019).

Originally from Carroll, Iowa, he graduated from Buena Vista College (IA) where he was a pitcher for the Beavers. Drafted in 1972 by the Yankees, he played one season for the Johnson City Yankees. His coaching career has taken him from Gonzaga, where he was the head coach (1979-80), to Texas El Paso for four years (1981-84) as their head coach. He became an assistant coach at Texas A&M in 1985, and was the assistant head coach from 1989 through 2005. The Aggies boasted a record of 876-433-3 during his tenure, appeared in the NCAA Tournament 13 times and made it to the College World Series twice (1993, 1999). In 2003, Lawler was named the National Assistant Coach of the Year by the ABCA and Baseball America. Lawler was the head coach at the University of Arkansas at Little Rock from 2005 to 2008, and an assistant with Team USA's 18U team in 2011 and 2012. After his years at Wareham, he was an assistant at Pepperdine (2020-2021).

His baseball trajectory changed directions in 1998 when he became a major league scout, first with the Seattle Mariners, then with Cleveland Indians and finally with the Minnesota Twins before retiring in 2024. of the Firebirds staff in 2023. In addition to providing athletic training services, she coordinates medical records documentation for the Firebirds. She currently lives in Providence, RI. O



Anyone attending a Firebirds game on a summer evening under the lights realizes what a special place our ballpark is. The partnership between the Firebirds organization, the Cape Cod Baseball League, and the great community of the Outer Cape has resulted in one of the finest places in the nation to watch a ball game. Each year, improvements are made as a result of the hard work of volunteers, contributions from businesses and individuals, and the support of town government. A major league baseball scout once said "this is as good a ball field as you'll find anywhere, majors or minors". A Philadelphia sportswriter called our field "A Norman Rockwell painting come to life." What might be less obvious to

the casual fan is that Eldredge Park is also a historic icon, representing over a century in the annals of a historic town. It is recognized as historically significant by both the Orleans and Massachusetts Historical Commissions. In 1913, Lewis Winslow "Win" Eldredge donated ten acres to the town "in

consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desire to provide a playground for them." Thus, the legacy began. Today, the land Win donated continues as a playground as well as the playing field for the top collegiate baseball players in the nation.

Work on the first baseball field at Eldredge Park began in 1915. The diamond was south of where it sits today, and faced to the northwest. The area was heavily wooded, and Eldredge Park Way did not yet exist. In 1927, the town initiated a project to improve the baseball field, and the Cape Cod Baseball League began playing here in 1928. Previously, the Orleans team played on a field near the intersection of Rt. 28 and 6A in the northern section of town. In 1929, the town began referring to the field as Eldredge Park in its Annual Reports, and the name has persisted ever since.

In the latter half of the twentieth century, a number of improvements were made to the park. In 1966, with a \$10,000 town appropriation and \$20,000 in donations, a

bandstand and tennis courts were constructed and the picnic area was established. In 1967, the configuration of the baseball field was rotated 90 degrees, with home plate being moved from left field to where you see it today. New soil was brought in, the outfield was re-seeded, and scores of recessed sprinklers were installed all over the field. Sod was laid in the infield, and the base paths were dug out and packed with six inches of clay. The pitcher's mound was re-done entirely with red clay, and home plate was stabilized. Eldredge Park was now of Major League quality.

The "New Eldredge Park" was dedicated at the CCBL All Star Game, played at the field on Sunday, July 23, 1967, when the Firebirds were known as the Cardinals. Participating in the dedication were Massachusetts Governor John Volpe, Lt. Governor Francis Sargent, and Attorney General Elliot Richardson. In his remarks, Governor Volpe paid tribute to the community partnership and hard work that brought the remarkable new field about.

In 1970, the Charles F. Moore Jr. Field House and Bandstand was constructed, and by 1971, Eldredge Park Way was under construction. Enhancements continued with stadium lights in 1979, the press box in 1982, and terraced seating on "the hill" in 1985.

More recent years have brought new lights (2001), a bigger Bird's Nest (2003), the Yawkey Grant reconstruction with dugouts, backstop and sideline netting, the knee wall and a rebuilt infield (2010), a custom-designed scoreboard (2019), an equipment shed (2023), and a new infield, safety netting system and pitch clocks (2024).

When you are enjoying a game at Eldredge Park, remember that the masterpiece in front of you did not just happen. It is the result of a remarkable 112-year journey made possible by an incredible amount of hard work, and the generosity and support of the Outer Cape community. It is a big part of what makes Orleans the special place that it is.


Irrepressible and irreplaceable, Margo passed away suddenly and unexpectedly last fall, leaving her family and friends in stunned disbelief. For many years, Margo coordinated the host families for the Birds, with her house being the central welcoming spot for new arrivals until they were placed; she never knew who would be parked on the couch, or even on the floor, when she came downstairs in the morning. She was a wonderful cook, and together with her husband Joe, many meals were served up to hungry ballplayers, who just happened to find themselves in the neighborhood at dinner time. She was in charge of fun, silliness and laughter as well, including the infamous sessions when hair colors (including mustaches) were transformed to blonde.

Born in Framingham, Margo became an amazing nurse, first in Boston area hospitals and then on Cape Cod beginning in the late 70s. She worked at Cape Cod Hospital, the Visiting Nurse Association and AIDS Support Group, as a private duty nurse, and finally for VNA Hospice where she helped and supported many on their final journey. Only five feet tall, she was still a force to be reckoned with, and for many years she taught martial arts and aerobics. Though she had a boundless work ethic, she was always up for a good time, and loved to go to the theater, especially musicals. October 21, 1965 - April 24, 2022

A key member of the 1986 Orleans Cardinals championship team, Texas native Kevin Garner was a multi-sport athlete in high school. Concentrating on baseball at the University of Texas, he continued to earn All American honors, and was a first rounder in the 1987 MLB draft, selected by the San Diego Padres. He enjoyed an 11-year professional career with several organizations, including the Padres, White Sox, Reds, Expos and Phillies, ending with seasons in the Mexican and Northern Leagues. After baseball, Kevin completed his degree, and pursued careers in real estate and coaching. He will be remembered in Orleans for his playoff heroics, hitting a series-winning walk-off home run against Chatham in the semi-finals, and another bomb that landed on the bandshell in Game 1 of the finals against Cotuit before the Cardinals completed their sweep in Game 2.








June 15, 1981 - January 24, 2019




# CCBL OBITUARIES



May 6, 1950 - December 20, 2024

Jeff Trundy's life in baseball began early in his Maine childhood, followed by a stellar college career at UNH. After serving as a graduate assistant coach at Colorado while earning his master's degree, he returned to Maine to be the head coach at Augusta's Cony HS for 20 years. Jeff then served as a teacher and head baseball coach at the Frederick Gunn School in Washington, Conn., from 1997 until his passing. He began his CCBL tenure in 1995 as an assistant, first with Cotuit and then Falmouth, where he became head coach in 1999. Through 2024, he amassed an overall record of 529-528-28 (.501), coached innumerable future major leaguers, and was selected by his fellow managers for the Mike Curran Award in 2004, 2016, 2019 and 2024. Known in the league and far beyond as "Gentleman Jeff," he was the perfect ambassador for the CCBL with his emphasis on coaching and mentorship, playing the game the right way, and ensuring the best possible experience for his players. Jeff was inducted into the Maine Baseball Hall of Fame in 2013 and the CCBL Hall of Fame in 2024.



Cape Cod and the Cape League both lost a champion with the untimely passing of Tom Cahir. A Bourne native, Tom played for his hometown Canalmen in the CCBL in 1971 while completing his bachelor's degree at American International College. Throughout his professional life, Tom was a constant supporter of the league, serving on many boards and committees while providing valuable contacts and networking with the Cape business community. Elected to the Mass. House of Representatives in 1985 to represent the 3rd Barnstable District, Tom spent 14 years in the legislature. He worked on the original Land Bank bill to preserve open space, and chaired the Joint Committee on Transportation, dealing with vital issues that benefitted the Cape and the Commonwealth. In 1999, he transitioned to the state's Executive Branch as the Deputy Secretary for Transportation Programs at the Executive Office of Transportation and Public Works (EOTPW), and then in 2009 he assumed leadership of the Cape Cod Regional Transit Authority, continuing to build and improve the region's transportation infrastructure which serves the needs of thousands of Cape Codders as well as the tourist industry. Besides playing baseball, Tom was an avid runner, completing 13 Boston Marathons and 40 Falmouth Road Races, and an accomplished golfer.



ore than 40,230 fans attended Firebirds games in 2024 regular season, consistently one of the top two drawing teams in the league. The July 3 game drew 4,753. The Firebirds organization always appreciates your continued, enthusiastic support.

It costs us more than \$300,000 a year to operate our team and to enhance historic Eldredge Park (established 1913) as one of the top collegiate summer baseball venues in America. The Firebirds receive 96% of the needed \$300,000 from Annual Fan Club Memberships, our Homeplate Retail Shop, our Youth Baseball Clinics, our game advertisers and generous contributions by our fans at games. All funds are raised through the Orleans Athletic Association, a 501 (c) (3) nonprofit organization, by a year-round volunteer staff. The generous outpouring of fan and community support has enabled the team to be financially stable.

The Firebirds receive indirect funding of about \$11,000 from MLB thru the CCBL. Unlike most CCBL teams the Firebirds receive no revenue from concessions opting to have this operated by Nauset Schools.

As with all organizations, The Firebirds every year are faced with increased operating costs in almost every aspect of operations as well as always having the responsibility to maintain, replace, and improve every aspect of our operations. Our Fan Club, started in 2011 has become our major fund-raising vehicle and continues to grow in membership. We have reached out beyond Orleans to Eastham, Wellfleet, Truro and Provincetown residents, as well as to our many summer visitors to join our donor team and assist us so we can continue to provide this wholesome, family orientated activity. Attendance at a Firebirds game is the best Cape Cod summer entertainment bargain available and the team continues to be the highlight of many vacation as well as a major source of local pride. Thank you for your annual support of the Fan Club and don't forget to display your Fan Club

# OUR CLINIC PHILOSOPHY

The co-ed clinic is dedicated to teaching the fundamentals of baseball. Skills and technical instruction will cover throwing, catching, fielding, hitting and base running. All levels of abilities are identified, and all instruction is based on the age, ability and playing experience of each boy and girl. A high instructor-to-child ratio ensures that each boy and girl receive personal attention and direction.





# **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Our Youth Summer Baseball Clinic offers kids a summer experience they will never forget. All participants receive instruction from the Firebird coaches and players to learn basic baseball skills and how to play the game, while having lots of fun along the way. 
