### **COACHES & TRAINERS**

### **SCOTT PICKLER**



#### Field Manager

One of the most respected veteran community college coaches in the nation. Scott Pickler has been at the helm of the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox since 1997. Pickler has enjoyed considerable success both within the Cape Cod Baseball League and at Cypress College, leading Y-D to six Cape League Championships (2004, 2006, 2007, 2014, 2015, 2016) and

runner-up finishes in two others, along with five regular season East Division crowns.

"Pick" took over a struggling Cypress program in 1985, guickly turning the Chargers into a respected California powerhouse. He has been chosen as the National Coach of the Year for California Junior Colleges four times. Pickler. who also served as a coach for the 1995 USA Baseball National Trials, has led Cypress to five state championships (1991, 1994, 1997, 2003, 2013) and four runner-up finishes (1996, 1999, 2004, 2007).

With all of his professional accomplishments, Pickler's biggest victories and proudest moments come when he sees his athletes move to four-year colleges and universities or the professional ranks. Over 200 student-athletes have received scholarships, and more than 120 players have been selected in the Major League Draft. There have been 15 former Cypress Chargers and several other Y-D Red Sox alums who have been brought up to the Majors in Pickler's tenure.

Before coming to Cypress, Pickler had an outstanding high school coaching career. In six seasons at Savanna and Loara (Calif.) high schools, he posted a combined record of 123-36 and won the CIF championship with his 1983 Loara squad. Pickler is a 1968 graduate of Savanna High. winning Athlete of the Year recognition. In January 2016, he and younger brother, Brad, were honored with induction into the Savanna High Hall of Fame.

He attended Cypress College and earned All-Conference recognition under Coach Larry Mercadante, later earning a degree in physical education from San Diego State University. During his time at SDSU, Pickler also played second base for the Aztecs.

Pickler and his wife, Sharon, have two children, Jeff and Kari. Jeff was an All-Conference choice for his father at Cypress in 1995 and then went on to be an All-American and Academic All-American at the University of Tennessee. Kari is a graduate of UCLA and was a Bruins Song Leader. She has performed on Broadway in the musical "Big", is the owner of The E-Factor, and is the mother of Scott's first grandchild. Pickler's brother, Brad, is the head coach of the softball team at Cypress and has led the Chargers to eight state championships.

### **JORDAN ABOITES**

**Assistant Coach** 



Jordan Aboites joins us after completing just his second full season of coaching college baseball. In 2019, he served as the volunteer assistant and infield coach at Biola University in La Mirada, California. Following the 2019 season. Aboites was named head coach of the So Cal Shepherds in the Sunset Baseball League where he was named the all-star game manager and

led the Shepherds to their first playoffs in program history.

Prior to coaching, Aboites completed his education at Arizona State University where he was a two-way player for the ASU Baseball Team from 2012-2016. In 2014, he received the "Fireman Award" as the team's Top Relief Pitcher, where he threw the most Innings out of the bullpen in the Pac-12. Aboites received numerous Pac-12 conference honors as both a Pitcher and an Infielder. He finished his Senior year as the starting 3rd baseman where he was named to the 2016 All-Defensive Team and had a 7-2 record with a 3.69 ERA on the mound. He also contributed to the Devils by playing second and shortstop all 4 years. After college, Aboites was signed as a Pitcher by the Toros De Tijuana where his team won the Mexican League Championship in 2017. He finished second in the teams "Rookie of the Year" running after striking out 18 through 23 1/3 innings and posting a 3.09 era through 20 games in his first professional season. Jordan played for 2 other MLB AAA Mexican League teams before retiring from baseball in 2018. Aboites graduated from Arizona State on the Dean's list with a degree in Communications and a minor in Family and Human Development. He received Scholar Baller recognition all 4 years as well as Pac-12 Academic awards for 2014, 2015 and 2016.

Currently, Jordan is the infield coach for Cypress Junior College alongside coach Pickler. He is completing his master's degree in Family and Human Development from Arizona State University.
