



#### MAY 31

Christian Yelich was outstanding in the Brewers' 12-5 win over the White Sox on Friday, connecting on a game-high five hits and being responsible for half of Milwaukee's runs as he drove in five RBIs and scored a run himself. The 2017 Professional Team alum made his first big play in the fourth inning, sending two runners home with a single to put the Brewers ahead 4-3. He proved instrumental once again in the seventh inning, driving in another pair of runs to extend Milwaukee's lead to 8-5 after they had just pulled ahead in the same inning. Yelich's final RBI came in the eighth inning as the Brewers were pulling away, another single that scored the team's 11th run on the day and helped seal the win.

Three-time USA Baseball alum Tanner Houck picked up his second straight win and fifth of the season as he led the Red Sox to a 7-3 win over the Tigers on Friday, hurling 7.0 innings and allowing just three hits and one run in his time on the mound. Remaining resilient after allowing two hits and the opening run to Detroit in the first inning, Houck responded by allowing one hit and striking out four batters over the next six innings before exiting with Boston leading 5-1. Now on a streak of four straight starts with one or fewer earned runs allowed and three straight wins, Houck's ERA sits at a stellar 1.85.

2019 Professional Team alum Jo Adell made history on Friday in the Angels' 5-4 loss to the Mariners, becoming the first MLB player since May of 2012 and the seventh ever player for Los Angeles to record a pinch-hit grand slam. Stepping up to the plate for the first time in the seventh inning with the bases loaded and his team down 4-0, Adell launched a clutch 360-foot shot into left to tie the game and stun the crowd in Seattle.

Bobby Witt Jr. and the Royals fell short against the Padres by a score of 11-8, with the two-time USA Baseball alum going 3-for-5 with two RBIs and two runs scored in the losing effort. Witt Jr. put Kansas City on the board in the sixth inning with an RBI single to left before scoring the Royals' third run of the inning on a sac fly for a 3-2 lead. San Diego jumped back ahead with nine runs in the eighth, taking an 11-3 advantage into the ninth inning. With their backs against the wall, Witt Jr. and the Royals nearly pulled off the comeback as they plated five runs in the final frame; Witt Jr. was right at the heart of it, sending another runner home and scoring Kansas City's eighth and final run of the contest as the bid fell just short.

After hitting a walkoff home run in the SEC Tournament last weekend, LSU's Steven Milam repeated the magic in the NCAA Tournament by hitting a walkoff homer against Wofford on Friday. Tied 3-3 with the Terriers, the freshman called game after launching a solo shot homer in the bottom of the ninth that kept the Tigers dancing in the Chapel Hill Regional. The 12U and 15U National Team alumni became the first Tiger in school history to hit multiple walkoff home runs in a season.

#### MAY 30

Detroit's Jack Flaherty was a force on the bump Thursday night, tossing 6.2 frames while tallying nine punchouts in the Tigers 5-0 victory over the Red Sox at Fenway Park. The Burbank, California native only gave up one hit in the contest allowing the Detroit offense to build a comfortable lead throughout the game. The former first round pick now leads the AL by racking up 90 punchouts throughout the course of the 2024 season. In his last three games, Flaherty has at least nine strikeouts, pitching a minimum of six innings in each game.

While Flaherty kept the Red Sox at bay on the mound, Riley Greene was one of three Tigers to go long in Detroit's 5-0 win. As his side entered the eighth inning holding a close 2-0 lead, Greene launched a two-run, 353-foot effort over Fenway Park's green monster to double Detroit's advantage and seal the game. The 2018 18U alum finished the contest 1-for-3 with two RBIs, one run scored, and a walk.





Five-time USA Baseball alumni Alex Bregman helped power the Astros to a 4-0 victory over the Mariners on Thursday, breaking the ice with a two-run shot in the fourth inning that traveled 358 feet into left. Bregman finished the contest 2-of-4 with a pair of RBIs and runs scored, reaching home for the second time in the sixth inning to score Houston's fourth run. Bregman's night marked the second time in the last three games where he's tallied a pair of RBIs on a pair of hits against Seattle.

Oakland's Shea Langeliers, a 2018 Collegiate National Team alum, launched his twelfth homer of the 2024 season into the stands in the Athletics' 6-5 loss on Thursday at Tropicana Field. Langeliers started his night with a double to left field in the top of the second frame. With Oakland down 2-3 in the top of the third inning, Langeliers took matters into his own hands and cranked a home run that traveled 406 feet to score two runs and take the lead. The catcher finished his night going 2-for-5 with a double, a home run and two RBIs.

# MAY 29

Will Smith had a loud night at Citi Field in his team's 10-3 win over the New York Mets. The 2023 World Baseball Classic alum and Dodgers hard-hitting catcher launched not one, but two home runs in Queens. While they were both solo shots, his first of which got the Dodgers on the board in the top of the first, Smith etched a final line of 3-for-5 with 2 RBIs in Los Angeles' blowout win over the Mets. His second long ball broke a 3-3 eighth inning deadlock and spurred his team to run away with the contest. The slugger's now hit four home runs in his past five games.

2009 18U National Team alumni Nick Castellanos cranked his seventh homer of the season to drive in two runs for the Phillies in their 6-1 win over the San Francisco Giants on Wednesday. The Hialeah, Florida native started his night with a single to right field in the top of the second inning and would eventually score to put the Phillies up 2-0. In the third frame, Castellanos doubled to left to add to his resume. Castellanos' bomb came in the fifth inning to put the Phillies up 4-0. The former first rounder now has 24 RBIs on the season.

Pittsburgh's Andrew McCutchen, a 2017 World Baseball Classic and 2004 18U National Team alum, jacked a three-run homer and four total RBIs in the Pirates' win at Detroit. The MLB vet recorded a 3-for-4 day and hit plated three in the third inning after taking the Tigers deep. McCutchen's four RBIs helped the Pirates engineer a 10-2 win in the Motor City.

Clearwater Threshers' Aidan Miller, a three-time USA Baseball member, turned in a 2-for-3 performance including a grand slam that went 372 feet over the left center field wall in the Threshers 9-8 loss to Lakeland Flying Tigers on Wednesday. The Phillies prospect garnered four RBIs to bring his 2024 total to 25 on the year. The former first round pick now has five homers this season and a .319 batting average.

### MAY 28

Druw Jones went 3-for-5 in the Visalia Rawhide's 13-12 win over the Inland Empire 66ers at Valley Strong Park on Tuesday. Jones, a member of the 2021 18U National Team, smacked a line drive triple to center field to drive in two runs in the bottom of the sixth inning. The Georgia native added a single and a double on the night, almost hitting for the cycle. Jones now has 10 multiple-hit games on the season.

Rob Refsnyder went 2-for-4 in the Red Sox's 8-3 win over the Baltimore Orioles on Tuesday night. The 2007 16U National Team alumni recorded his second straight multi-hit game while launching a two-run shot in his team's win at Camden Yards. Refsnyder's bomb came in the ninth inning and helped pad Boston's previously close 5-3 lead. Unable to catch up, the USA Baseball alum put the contest out of reach for the home side.





2021 18U National team alumni Jackson Holliday blasted his sixth home run of the season for the Norfolk Tides, a solo shot that traveled 410 feet into center and put his side on the board in the first inning. While the Tides fell to the Gwinnett Stripers by a score of 4-2, Holliday has now tallied at least a hit in five straight games with five RBIs, five runs scored, and four walks over that stretch.

**ALUMNI REPORT** 

Lynchburg Hillcats' Ralphy Velazquez, a 2017 12U National team member, had himself a day at the plate, crushing two doubles to guide the Hillcats past the Worcester Red Sox, 6-4, on Tuesday. The first baseman drove in a run with his first double to right field in the bottom of the fifth frame and would later score in the same inning. The Guardians prospect kept his six-game hitting streak alive on his 19th birthday in the contest.

2021 Collegiate National Team alum Kyle Teel kept his strong month of May going with a two-run home run for the Portland Sea Dogs. Playing the Curve, Teel smashed a long ball into deep right field to cut his team's 4-0 deficit in half. The ex-Virginia Cavalier now has 17 RBIs in the month of May.

### MAY 27

Toronto's George Springer went 2-for-3 with two RBIs in the Blue Jays 5-1 win over the Chicago White Sox at Guaranteed Rate Field in Chicago on Monday. The former first round pick crushed a two-run homer in the top of the second frame to put the first runs on the board of the game. Springer, a 2010 Collegiate Team member, got on base again as he singled to left field, eventually scoring in the top of the ninth to secure the victory for his squad.

Phillies' Kyle Schwarber, a 2013 Collegiate Team and 2023 World Baseball Classic alumni, blasted a home run to right center in the third frame in an 8-4 loss to the San Francisco Giants on Monday. Schwarber got on base again with a walk in the top of the fourth frame and stole second base which was good for his third on the season. Later in the seventh inning, the former first rounder reached on an infield single. The Middletown, OH native now ranks 7th in the National League at Times on Base (88).

2018 18U National Team alumni CJ Abrams turned in a two-RBI performance while also scoring one run for Washington in an 8-4 victory over the Atlanta Braves at Truist Park. The Nationals' shortstop went 2-for-4 on the day, crushing one over the right field wall in the top of the second inning. To keep the scoring affair alive, Abrams hit a sacrifice fly to score another run in the sixth frame to tally the final runs for the Nationals on the day.

### **MAY 26**

Paul Goldschmidt hit two vital home runs in the Cardinals' 4-3 win over the Chicago Cubs on Sunday. The 2017 and 2023 World Baseball Classic player recorded four RBIs in his 2-for-4 day, smashing third and fifth inning homers in back-to-back plate appearances. Goldschmidt hit his team's only RBIs of the day in the Cardinals' win over their divisional rival and was instrumental in his team's fifth win in a row.

2010 16U National Team alumni and World Series MVP Corey Seager wasn't the only USA Baseball alum to hit not one, but two home runs on Sunday. Seager hit two out of the park in the Rangers' 6-2 win at Minnesota on Sunday while tallying three RBIs. His first long ball was a two-run shot in the third inning to draw first blood against the Twins while his second was good for his sixth home run in just as many days.

Atlanta's Matt Olson went 3-for-5 in his team's blowout win over the Pittsburgh Pirates at home on Sunday. The Braves' first baseman and 2010 16U National Team alumni broke out of his hitting slump with a three-RBI day at Truist Park. Olson also belted a home run out of Truist Park in his team's 8-1 victory.





2018 and 2019 Collegiate National Team alumni Spencer Torkelson helped propel the Detroit Tigers over Toronto in a back-and-forth contest on Sunday at home. The Tigers' first baseman went 3-for-5 with one RBI and three runs scored. Torkelson fired up the offense in the bottom of the third inning as he cranked a solo home run over the left field wall. The former first overall pick kicked off the bottom of the ninth frame with a single shot to left field which put the winning run on base. Torkelson crossed the plate on a Matt Vierling home run to secure the win for the Tigers, 14-11.

### MAY 25

Erick Fedde, who pitched on USA Baseball's 2013 Collegiate National Team, pitched 6.1 frames of scoreless ball in the White Sox's 5-3 loss to Baltimore. Chicago's starter flamed six strikeouts while only giving up three hits in his time on the mound. Fedde's now had three scoreless outings in his last four starts and has tallied six K's in two of those starts.

Marcus Stroman moved his 2024 ERA down to a strong 2.76 in his impressive outing at San Diego for the New York Yankees. The pitcher, who made an appearance in the 2017 World Baseball Classic, etched a final line of six innings pitched, three hits given up, one walk, and five K's. Most impressively, the righty held the Padres scoreless in his time on the mound, leading the Bronx Bombers to a 4-1 win on the West Coast.

As one of USA Baseball's Alumni Tracker mainstays, Bryce Harper had another loud evening for the Philadelphia Phillies. The former Golden Spikes award winner and 16U and 18U National Team player racked up four RBIs and a home run while going 2-for-4 in the Phils' 8-4 win at Colorado. Harper smashed a three-run bomb in Philadelphia's six-run, ninth inning rally for a 8-4 comeback victory over the Rockies in Denver.

12U and 15U National Team alumni and LSU Tiger Steven Milam hit an epic, walk-off home run in his team's barnburning win over South Carolina in the SEC Tournament. Down 11-10 to the Gamecocks in extra innings in the SEC semifinals, the freshman second baseman launched his walk-off bomb over the centerfield wall, highlighting his already-impressive tournament in Hoover, Alabama. Milam's long ball was good for his sixth RBI and second homer of the tourney.

## MAY 24

Three-time USA Baseball alumni Patrick Bailey launched a monstrous, go-ahead grand slam at Citi Field against the New York Mets on Friday night. The hard-hitting catcher and 2018 and 2019 Collegiate team alum shocked Mets fans everywhere as he quickly changed his team's 3-6 deficit into a one-run lead with just one swing. Bailey's Giants went on to win it 8-7 in Queens as he also tacked on a stolen base to his 2-for-4 night.

Another three-time USA Baseball alumni hit a homer on Friday night. While his team didn't win in epic fashion like Bailey's Giants did, Andrew Vaughn tallied two RBIs and a home run in a 2-for-3 performance in Chicago for the White Sox. The 2013 15U National Team and 2017 and 2018 Collegiate National team veteran most notably blasted a game-tying, seventh-inning solo shot against the Orioles to tie the contest at 4-4, even though Baltimore ultimately won in the Windy City.

Wake Forest's Nick Kurtz played a key role in the Demon Deacons' thrilling, 12-inning victory over North Carolina in the ACC Tournament on Friday night. Coming up huge in the clutch, all three of Kurtz' RBIs came in the ninth inning or after on his 2-for-4 night in Charlotte. With UNC threatening to send its intra-state rivals home in the ninth, Kurtz laced a game-tying RBI-double to right center field. While the Tar Heels and Deacons went blow-for-blow in extras, the first baseman called game with a two-run, go-ahead blast that bounced off the scoreboard in the twelfth inning, leading his team to a 9-5 victory in the Queen City.





### **MAY 23**

Two-time USA Baseball alum Kevin Gausman put together his strongest outing of the season for the Blue Jays on Thursday, racking up a season-high 10 strikeouts in Toronto's 9-1 triumph over Detroit. Gausman stymied the Tigers in his 6.0 innings on the mound, allowing just five players to reach base and just one earned run. The Blue Jays' pitcher was untouchable over the third and fourth innings, fanning all three Detroit batters in the third and adding two more in the fourth as Gausman preserved his side's lead

2013 Collegiate National Team alumni Matt Chapman helped key a late four-run comeback by the Giants as San Francisco stormed back for a 7-6 win over Pittsburgh. With the Pirates up 6-2 in the eighth inning, Chapman mashed a three RBI, 407-foot home run into center that ignited a five-run Giants frame and helped secure the victory. Chapman ends San Francisco's three game series against Pittsburgh in scorching form, having homered in all three games while totaling six RBIs on five hits.

2023 Collegiate National Team alum Christian Moore was one of two Tennessee players to tally a 3-for-5 statline at the plate as the No. 1 ranked Volunteers knocked off No. 4 Texas A&M 7-4 to advance to the quarterfinals of the SEC tournament. Moore scored Tennessee's first run in the bottom of the third inning, rounding the bases after getting aboard via a single to even the score at 1-1. He'd give the Volunteers their first lead of the matchup in the following inning, driving in a run with a groundout to first base as Tennessee took a 2-1 advantage and never trailed the rest of the way.

2022 18U National team alum Jake Brown helped LSU outlast South Carolina in a thrilling 11-10 affair on Thursday, going 3-for-5 with two RBIs and two runs scored as the Tigers advanced to the semifinals of the SEC tournament. Both of Brown's RBIs came on a vital home run in the fourth inning, part of a four-run stretch to tie the game at 5-5 after reigning national champions had fallen behind early. He played a crucial role in the game-deciding ninth inning, first helping advance the run that would tie the game at 10-10 with a single and then scoring the game-winning run after advancing to third.

### **MAY 22**

2017 18U National Team alum Nolan Gorman continued his hot streak with the Cardinals after going 2-for-2 with a home run and three RBIs in Wednesday's contest with the Orioles. His two-run, go-ahead shot into the center field stands at Busch Stadium finalized St. Louis' 3-1 win over Baltimore. Over his last 10 games, Gorman has hit four home runs and tallied nine RBIs while sporting a .345 batting average.

While Gorman hit the go-ahead homer against the Orioles, his fellow USA Baseball alum, Lance Lynn, earned a win in the Cardinals' 3-1 victory in St. Louis while on the mound. Until Gorman did his thing, Lynn kept his cool in a low-scoring pitcher's duel, dealing five strikeouts in six-innings of scoreless ball. The World Baseball Classic and 2007 Collegiate National Team alumni only gave up two hits in his six frames of work.

2023 Professional team alum J.T. Realmuto played a huge role helping the Phillies pull away from the Rangers for an 11-4 win on Wednesday night, posting a 2-for-5 line at the plate with a home run, three RBIs, and a pair of runs scored. Realmuto's homer, a 387-footer into left, gave Philadelphia the lead for the first time as it took a 3-2 advantage in the third inning. It also made history for the Phillies as the franchise's 14,000th home run. Realmuto's other hit on the night, a single in the sixth inning, drove in a pair of runs to put the Phillies ahead 8-3.

2021 18U alum RJ Austin was one of two Vanderbilt players to rack up a game-high three hits in a massive upset of No. 1 ranked Tennessee in the second round of the SEC Tournament, with the No. 8 seeded





Commodores stunning the Volunteers by a score of 13-4 in Hoover, Alabama. Austin's first hit was a single in the third inning, with a home run bringing him in to score one of five Vanderbilt runs in the frame for a 5-1 lead. Austin's second hit, a double in the fifth inning, advanced another Commodore into position on third to score on a ground out. History repeated itself in the seventh inning, as Austin singled again and would be brought in to score via home run as Vanderbilt went up 9-4.

#### MAY 21

Two-time USA Baseball alumni Bobby Witt Jr. was electric in Kansas City's 10-3 win over Detroit, powering the Royals to their fifth straight win with a 3-for-4 performance at the plate that featured two home-runs, six RBIs, three runs scored, and a stolen base. Witt Jr.'s six RBIs tied his career high, and Tuesday's win was also his first multiple home-run game of the season. The Royals' shortstop opened the scoring in the bottom of the first inning, recording an RBI single and scoring to make it 2-0. Witt Jr. demolished his first home run of the day in the fifth inning, a 468-moonshot for another three Kansas City runs that was the longest of his career. Witt Jr. would make it three straight innings with an RBI by adding a sac fly in the third for an 8-0 Royals lead, and capped off the win by sending another ball over the center field wall in the sixth inning, this time a 425-foot solo blast.

Kyle Tucker clubbed a pair of homers for the second time in three games on Tuesday, helping the Astros earn a 6-5 win over the Angels in extra innings. The two-time USA Baseball alumni's 16th and 17th home runs of the season, both solo shots, gave him the league lead. Tucker's 2-for-4 line, complete with two RBIs and three runs scored, began with his first homer in the bottom of the first inning. His second blast, a 407-footer into right, brought Houston level with Los Angeles at 5-5 and proved to be the run that forced extra innings. In the bottom of the 10th inning, it would be Tucker who once again came through for the Astros as he scored the walk-off run.

Minnesota's Joe Ryan tossed seven scoreless frames in the Twins' dominant, 10-0 shutout win in Washington, D.C. The USA Baseball alumni only gave up three hits and two free passes while throwing six strikeouts and collecting the win as he led the Twins to a victory on the road.

15U National Team alum Drew Burress made his name known at this year's ACC Tournament in Charlotte when Georgia Tech took on Florida State in the first round. While the Yellow Jackets lost in a barnburner, Burress did his part to make the contest close. The newly announced ACC freshman of the year racked up three RBIs on three hits, including a solo shot to get his team on the board early in the Queen City.

### **MAY 20**

Three-time USA Baseball alumni Tanner Houck pitched seven scoreless innings in Boston's shutout victory in Tampa Bay. With his smooth slider in full command, Houck flamed five strikeouts and only gave up two hits while collecting a win as the Red Sox beat their AL East rival 5-0.

2017 18U alum Ryan Weathers tossed seven solid innings for the Marlins in their walk-off win in the 10th inning on Monday against the Brewers. While Weathers exited the game with his side trailing 2-0, he played a key part in keeping Miami in the game by allowing just two hits and one earned run in his time on the mound, fanning eight batters in the process.

Daulton Varsho's second-inning bomb into right center set the Blue Jays on their way to a 9-3 victory over the White Sox on Monday to open the series between the two sides. With Toronto in an early 1-0 hole, Varsho crushed a two-RBI, 398-footer to give the Blue Jays a lead they would hold for the rest of the game. He'd tally his second hit in the eighth inning, scoring his second run as well as Toronto iced the win.





Washington's Jesse Winker blasted his second home run in just as many days in the Nationals' 12-3 blowout win over the Twins. The USA Baseball Alum recorded an RBI on his solo shot and also ripped a double in his 2-for-4 day in D.C. Winker has also recorded an RBI in three straight days.

### MAY 19

Two-time USA Baseball alum Kyle Tucker tied for the MLB-lead with 15 home runs as he launched two in Houston's 9-4 win over the Brewers on Sunday, driving in four RBIs and putting the Astros out of reach. Tucker's first homer of the day came in the bottom of the sixth inning, a 390-foot shot into right center that gave the Astros a 6-1 lead. Just after the Brewers had cut the advantage down to two runs in the top of the seventh inning, Tucker delivered a clutch three-run blast over the left-field wall in the bottom of the frame to restore his side's lead to five.

Pro Team alum and the MLB's RBI, batting average, and OBP leader Alec Bohm added to his All-Star worthy 2024 resume with a monstrous five-RBI day against the Nationals in Philadelphia. Bohm's only hit of the day was a 403-foot bomb into the left field stands at Citizens Bank Park that scored three, solidified the Phillies' 11-5 win over the Nats, and furthered the third baseman's star status this season.

Brent Rooker (2019 Pro) continued his impressive month of May with another solid outing for the Oakland A's. The former Golden Spikes Award finalist tallied three RBIs and a home run despite his team's loss in Kansas City. His 2-for-4 day bumped Rooker up to an impressive 19 RBI's in May.

### MAY 18

Following a 3-for-4 outing on Friday where he tallied a pair of doubles and scored three times in 10-5 victory for the San Francisco Giants over the Colorado Rockies, 2013 CNT alum Matt Chapman was a perfect 4-4 at the plate as the Giants rolled to a 14-4 victory over the Rockies on Saturday, the only player to tally four hits in the matchup. Chapman was a consistent offensive threat throughout, reaching base five times and scoring in the first inning, third inning, seventh inning, and eighth inning as the Giants never trailed in the matchup.

2014 CNT alum Walker Buehler collected his first win of the season on Saturday, hurling six shutout innings for the Dodgers and setting the tone for a 4-0 shutout victory over the Reds. Buehler fanned seven batters while allowing just three hits, and went all six innings without giving up a walk to a Cincinnati hitter.

2017 18U alum Nolan Gorman was a key part of the Cardinals' 7-2 triumph over the Red Sox on Saturday, opening the scoring with his second home run in as many games and helping to seal the result late. Gorman broke the ice in the bottom of the second inning, electrifying the St. Louis crowd with a 372-foot solo shot into right field to give his side the lead. In the bottom of the eighth inning, after Boston had tied the game at 2-2, Gorman stepped to the plate and sparked a five-run half-inning by delivering a huge single to put the Cardinals ahead 3-2. His second RBI proved to be the winning run, as St. Louis would carry the lead the rest of the way.

2016 18U alum Logan Allen continued his strong year for the Guardians on Saturday, improving to 5-2 on the season as he held the Twins scoreless over six innings of action on the mound in an 11-4 home victory for Cleveland. Allen limited Minnesota to just five hits as the Guardians' offense went to work, being relieved following the sixth inning having struck out seven batters and allowed just six to reach base.





# MAY 17

Paul Skenes took the baseball world by storm on Friday with his first-career MLB win. The three-time Team USA alum took it to the Cubs in Chicago by striking out the first seven batters he faced and tossing six innings of no-hit baseball. Skenes ended his six frames in the Windy City with 100 pitches, no walks, no earned runs, and a whopping 11 strikeouts while making highlight reels everywhere with his 100+ mph stuff.

**ALUMNI REPORT** 

Former Golden Spikes Award semifinalist and USA Baseball alum Tyler Anderson led the Los Angeles Angels to a 9-3 win over the Texas Rangers while throwing a strong seven innings for the Halos. Anderson threw seven frames, only gave up two hits and one earned run while throwing four strikeouts and collecting a win in Arlington.

Giants third baseman Matt Chapman (2013 CNT) smoked a pair of two-baggers in his team's 10-5 win over the Colorado Rockies on Friday. Chapman's duo of doubles helped him collect an RBI and three runs in San Francisco's win. The USA Baseball alum went 3-for-4 on the day and also added a stolen base to his statline in the victory.

2021 18U alum Gavin Kilen tied for the game-high with two hits in the Louisville Cardinals' 14-4 win over the Notre Dame Fighting Irish on Friday, driving in three RBIs and scoring a run on a pair of doubles. Kilen scored his lone run of the day in the fourth inning, reaching home on a sac fly into center field. He'd tally his first RBI via a fielder's choice in the sixth inning, and added two more to complete the Louisville rout in the eighth inning with a double into left center.

### **MAY 16**

New York Yankees shortstop and three-time U.S. alum Anthony Volpe got his team off to a loud start in Minnesota when he hit a leadoff home run into the left field stands at Target Field. The USA Baseball alum went 2-for-5 in the Yankees' 5-0 win over the Twins and extended his hitting streak to five games.

2018 CNT alum Bryson Stott stuffed the statsheet in the Phillies' 6-5 loss to the Mets, recording a hit, driving in two runs and scoring one himself, stealing a pair of bases, and drawing a walk. Stott's lone hit of the game came at a perfect time, as he singled into right field in the bottom of the ninth inning with his side down 4-3 to drive in the game-tying run and force extra innings. After the Phillies conceded a pair of runs in the top of the 11th inning, Stott nearly kick-started another comeback as he drove in another run thanks to a fielder's choice.

With his team down 4-3, Texas' Casey Borba (2022 18U) hit a clutch solo shot home run in the bottom of the ninth inning in Austin. After knotting his team's contest with Kansas at 4-4, the freshman's pinch-hit homer paved the way for the Longhorns to walk off the Jayhawks later that inning.

Simeon Woods Richardson (2021 OLY) made the best start in baseball on Monday, posting six shutout innings while allowing just one hit. The righthander struck out eight and walked one, facing just two batters over the minimum through six innings. He currently owns a 1.74 ERA through four starts in 2024.

### MAY 5

The Cardinals' ace turned in another seven shutout innings on Friday, allowing just three hits in a win over the White Sox. Gray–who has allowed zero runs in three of his five starts–owns a 0.89 ERA to this point in the season.

Drew Burress (2019 15U) hit two homers and drove in six runs for Georgia Tech in a big win over Clemson on Friday. Burress now has hit multiple home runs in five games this season and has 20 overall for his freshman campaign.

CNT alum Trey Yesavage continued his dominant junior year with 11 punch outs in seven innings to earn the win against South Florida. Yesavage now owns a 1.69 ERA and a 10-1 record for ECU this season, bringing his career record to 18-2 for the Pirates.

### **MAY 2**

Four-time U.S. alum Pete Crow-Armstrong had a multi-hit game on Thursday against the Mets, his second since being called up on April 24. The center fielder notched two RBIs for the Cubs in the contest, bringing his season total to seven through nine games played at the big-league level in 2024.
