




In the off-season, we invested over \$250,000 to upgrade our facility in several ways. We expanded and improved the quality of our netting, removed our outdated backstop, added a brick wall behind home plate, and covered the bulk of the inside of the wall with padding. We repositioned some of our bleachers to improve site lines for fans, rebuilt a significant portion of our merchandise booth, added pitch clocks, and did extensive upgrading to our electrical systems. We also upgraded our website, and acquired new equipment to enhance our broadcasts.

SCOTT PICKLER



Field Manager

Experience: 26th Season
Alma Mater: San Diego State

One of the most respected community college coaches in the nation, Scott Pickler completed his 35th season as head coach at Cypress College in 2018. Pickler has won more than 1,000 games and coached more than 125 players

who have gone on to play in the MLB. He has won five state championships as the head coach at Cypress College in addition to claiming six Cape Cod League championships as coach of the Yarmouth Dennis Red Sox. Pick was selected in 2019 to the ABCA Hall of Fame, also is a member of the Cape Cod Hall of Fame, Cypress College Hall of Fame, and Savanna High Hall of Fame.

Since taking over at Cypress in 1985, Pickler has amassed a career record of over 1000 wins and led the Chargers to State Championship in 1991, 1994, 1997, 2003, and 2013. Pick has been to the final four 11 times, winning 5, finishing 2nd four times.

Pickler has been selected as the California Community College Coach of the Year four times and was awarded the Lifetime Achievement Award from the California Community College Athletics Association (CCCAA) in 2016.

More than 400 of Pickler's student-athletes have received scholarships at four-year schools and more than 126 players have been selected in the Major League Draft. 23 of Pickler's former Chargers have played in the big leagues, including 2018 MLB Hall of Fame inductee Trevor Hoffman as well as 2017 MLB All-Star Jason Vargas. Hoffman played shortstop at Cypress College and the University of Arizona before transitioning to the mound while in the minor leagues.

Pickler has also spent 25 seasons as a coach in the Cape Cod Baseball League, where 116 of his players have gone on to play Major League Baseball. He led the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox to league championships in 2004, 2006, 2007, 2014, 2015 and 2016.

Pickler also served as a coach for the 1995 USA Baseball National Trials.

Prior to Cypress, Pickler coached for six seasons at Savanna and Loara High Schools in California. He posted a combined record of 123-36 (.774) and won the CIF championship with his 1983 Loara squad.

Pickler is a 1968 graduate of Savanna High School where he won a CIF championship under head coach Jim Reach and was named Savanna Athlete of the

Year. He was inducted into the school's Hall of Fame alongside his brother, Brad, in 2016.

He attended Cypress College, where he earned ALL-Conference recognition in baseball. He went on to earn a degree in physical education from San Diego State University, where he played as a second baseman.

Pick's lovely wife Sharon, worked in education with autistic students, and other students with special needs. She also spent time as a principals secretary. She is supportive of every team Pick is involved with. She is also "Magga" to two grandkids.

Scott and Sharon have two kids, Jeff who played for Pick one season, before going to Tennessee and becoming The SEC player of the year, a unanimous Division 1st team All American, as well as an Academic All American. He is in his 8th year as a big-league coach and currently is the bench coach for the Cincinnati Reds. Jeff's wife Erica was a high school science teacher and was a pole vaulter at UCLA.

Their daughter Kari, was song leader at UCLA, she spent a year performing on Broadway in the play "Big". Kari and her husband Chris, who was a quarterback at Univ. Connecticut, run their own family company, putting on major events. Bailey 12. and Brandt 10 are Sharon and Scott's favorite pastime now, watching them cheer and play many sports.

CRAIG GIANINNO



Assistant Coach

Started with Y-D: 2022
Alma Mater: Sacred Heart Cathedral High School Bellevue University (NE) '95 CWS Champion

Craig is a wonderful addition to the Y-D Red Sox Coaching Staff and is back in his 2nd year in Coach Pickler's dugout. He brings a wealth

of knowledge about the game of baseball and the process it takes to become a champion. With years of experience, Coach Gianinno brings a unique perspective to the Red Sox that players and staff can turn to for guidance. Coach Gianinno's resume as a mentor and coach is of great value to the Y-D Red Sox, providing both players and staff with a unique point of view when competing.

Craig Gianinno is a native from San Francisco, where he attended Sacred Heart Cathedral. Gianinno played collegiately at CCSF. He was named the team's most valuable player and earned all-conference honors. He later transferred to the College of Marin, where he played for ABCA Hall of Fame Baseball Coach Al Endriss.

COACHES & TRAINERS

Gianinno was selected to the Northern California All Star Team. He earned all-conference honors and led the Mariners to the California State Playoffs. Gianinno completed his collegiate career at Bellevue University, (NE) culminating as a member of the 1995 College World Series National Championship Team which was inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2018. Gianinno was nominated by his teammates to deliver the induction speech.

Craig and his wife Bonnie reside in Sparta, NJ with their twin daughters, Eliana and Sophia.

BRETT ADCOCK



Assistant Coach

Started with Y-D: 2024

Alma Mater: Ashville High School, Ashville, NC

Brett joins Y-D this season, with several years of baseball experience under his belt. Brett played for the Y-D Red Sox during its historic 2015 championship season. While at University of Michigan, he earned

several honors, including Freshman All American (2014), the All Big Ten Third Team (2015), the All Big Ten Tournament Team (2015), the All Big Ten Second Team (2016). In that season, he made 14 starts and held opposing batters to a .190 average. He ranks sixth all-time at Michigan with a 3.09 ERA. In 2016, he was drafted by the Houston Astros, and spent four seasons playing professional ball.

SKY DUFF



Assistant Coach

Started with Y-D: 2024

Alma Mater: Unaffiliated

Sky Duff joins the Y-D Red Sox after completing his first season as a graduate manager with the University of Pittsburgh baseball team. Duff spent the entirety of his five-year collegiate career at Pittsburgh, breaking numerous

school records and earning multiple individual and team awards. His name is littered all throughout the Pitt baseball record book.

Duff ranks first all-time in walks (171) and doubles (54), second all-time in career games played (213) and at-bats (794), third all-time in games started (207), fifth all-time in runs scored (163), eighth all-time in hits (226), and 13th all-time in total bases (314). Among these accolades, Duff finished his career with 10 home runs, 10 stolen bases, two triples and 95 RBI while hitting .285

with a .420 on-base percentage.

Following what was arguably his best year at Pitt, in 2021, the then-junior earned ABCA/Rawlings All-East Region Second Team and All-ACC Third Team honors at third base. Duff recorded single-season career highs in many offensive statistical categories as he batted .366 and slugged .524 with 60 hits and 18 doubles while he maintained a .461 on-base percentage. He ended the season with active 21-game on-base and 13-game hit streaks, ranking fourth in the ACC in on-base percentage and fifth in batting average.

The Shamong, NJ native played high school ball at Bishop Eustace Prep in Pennsauken, NJ. Duff was a was a four-year varsity player at Bishop Eustace and helped lead them to two conference championships.

DAVID HIGUERA



Assistant Coach

Started with Y-D: 2024

Alma Mater: Clairmont University, Clairmont, CA

David Higuera joins the Y-D Red Sox after completing his second season as an assistant coach with Clairmont University in Clairmont, CA. In 2023, he helped the Stags to a 28-11 record, the highest win total

for the program since 1986. The Stags also set a program record for most SCIAC wins by finishing 18-6 in the league.

Higuera arrived at CMS after serving for three seasons an assistant coach at Caltech, where he was the program's third-base coach and outfield coach, while also assisting with strength and conditioning and recruiting.

Prior to Caltech, he worked as an assistant coach and graduate assistant at Georgetown College, his alma mater, where he had similar duties, while also managing expenses and transportation.

Higuera has also had a career path in the education field, working as a science, history and PE teacher at St. Andrew Catholic School, and serving as the athletic director at Community Charter High School. He was previously a physical education and ELA teacher at Santa Rosa Charter School for one year, and a physical education and technology teacher at St. Timothy Catholic School for one year.

Higuera earned his BA in communication from Georgetown College in 2015, with a minor in psychology, and went on to earn his master's in education from Georgetown as well. He added a second master's degree in health and wellness from the American College of Education in 2017.

Regala graduated from Bonita Vista High School in 2015, while being a part of the Barons' first CIF Championship in 2014. After high school, Regala went on to play at Southwestern Community College in 2016-2017.

Regala graduated from Grand Canyon University and earned a Bachelor's Degree in Pre-Physical Therapy. In 2021, Regala was crowned champion in the 68th Annual OMBAC Open Over-The-Line tournament.

CONOR BAXTER

Conor Baxter, who hails from London, England, returns to the Y-D Red Sox after serving as a Graduate Assistant Coach at Southern Arkansas University (SAU), a perennial D2

While at SAU, Baxter worked with hitters, and defensively with catchers, and infielders, applying his passion for data analytics and hitting biomechanics to enhance their performance and development. Baxter also is pursuing an MBA in Business Administration with a Data Science focus, building on his BA in Economics from Transylvania University, where he was a 4-year baseball team member.

Baxter previously worked as a Data Analyst/Baseball Operations role at the Y-D Red Sox, where he created and delivered scouting reports using Trackman and Synergy Data. Baxter also worked as a Data Analytics Intern at the Louisville Slugger Hitting Science Center, where he conducted research studies and helped design and create a more effective training environment with instant and understandable feedback for the players. He is a member of the Society for American Baseball Research (SABR) and Rapsodo Hitting Certified.

CAPE LEAGUE MAKES DREAMS COME TRUE



The Cape League is about many things. Family-friendly entertainment. A hot dog and soft drink after a day at the beach. But for many young men, it offers life-changing experiences.

In the spring of 2023, Will King, then a junior at Eastern Kentucky University, was exiting class when his baseball coach hollered, "Hey Will, how'd you like to play on the Cape this summer?" Will stopped in his tracks and simply said "yes!" The two men embraced and, shortly thereafter, Will signed to play catcher for the Y-D Red Sox.

The New York native made an immediate impact upon joining Y-D, playing almost every game and batting over .300. In an era in which many MLB players fan nearly once per game, Will made news by going over 35 plate appearances before striking out. "I have always had good bat-to-ball skills and I just took it one at a time," he recalled.

Joining Y-D was a dream come true. "I remember going to the Cape with my family many years ago. We attended a Cape League game. The atmosphere was

great and I always wanted to come back and play here," Will recalled.

Will's exploits on the diamond drew the attention of professional scouts. So when the MLB draft took place last July, Will was anxious and excited. "I knew the draft was taking place, but we had a game that day and I was in the dugout trying to stay focused."

Suddenly, the large crowd gathered at Red Wilson Field started cheering, as word spread that Will had been drafted by the Atlanta Braves. "It was one of the best days of my life. My parents, brother and best friend were all there to celebrate with me. It was a really cool moment."

Will immediately headed to Florida, where he joined the Braves affiliate in the Florida Complex League. He played regularly and batted over .300 with a home run in a short season. Then it was off to the Braves' A-ball affiliate, where he saw how full-time professionals train and prepare each day.

Will enjoyed the Cape Cod experience outside the lines. "It was the best summer ever. I met a lot of nice people, made some great friends, and loved the Cape Cod atmosphere. It was beautiful." He especially bonded with his host family. "It was the perfect situation. We got along great. I still talk regularly with my host about baseball, the Boston Red Sox, and what I have been up to."

This past winter, Will got a call from the Braves main office. The team acquired former Boston Red Sox star Chris Sale and needed someone to catch a bullpen session. Will jumped at the chance. "Chris is a very cool guy. He had very fond memories of playing for the Y-D Red Sox back when he was in college, and we talked about our experiences."

Will hopes one day to play Major League Baseball. But even when that happens, he will always remember his summer with the Y-D Red Sox. Asked for one word to describe his experience? "Unforgettable."

EXPERT ADVICE FROM AN EXPERT FOUL BALL CHASER



One of the most memorable experiences a young fan can have at a Cape League game is grabbing a foul ball. Looking for some advice about how to get one? Just ask our superfan, Liam Bradford!

Liam, a third grader, plays pitcher, catcher and shortstop on his youth baseball team, and attends

Y-D baseball camps every summer. He also loves to attend Y-D baseball games, both home and away, with his father, Daryl, a volunteer with the team's finance department.

But unlike most fans, Liam is not one to sit and watch the action from a beach chair. Instead, this young man stands and watches carefully so he can chase after every foul ball.

Last season alone, Liam collected about fifty different foul balls, all of which now sit in a large bucket in his family's summer residence.

Reached at his home during the school year, Liam gladly shared some basic tips for securing a Cape League baseball. "One, watch the hitters early in the game to see where they are hitting foul balls, and then remember that in their later at-bats. Then, once the foul ball is hit, run fast toward it and if the ball is on the ground, do not be afraid to slide. Finally, go to the All-Star game and get there early for batting practice."

Liam is but one example of the loyal fans - young and old - that enjoy the thrill of attending ballgames on the Cape. Some fans enjoy tracking the players' stats, some like the ballpark food, while others just love the relaxed atmosphere.

For Liam - it's all about the chase.


