

Scott Pickler



Position: Manager Experience: 18th season Alma Mater: San Diego State

One of the most respected veteran community college coaches in the nation, 2015 marks Scott Pickler's 18th season at the helm of the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox. Pickler has enjoyed considerable success both within the Cape Cod Baseball League and at Cypress College, leading Y-D

to four Cape League Championships (2004, 2006, 2007, 2014) and runner-up finishes in two others, along with five East Division crowns.

"Pick" took over a struggling Cypress program in 1985, quickly turning the Chargers into a respected California powerhouse. He has been chosen as the National Coach of the Year for California Junior Colleges four times. Pickler, who also served as a coach for the 1995 USA Baseball National Trials, has led Cypress to five state championships (1991, 1994, 1997, 2003, 2013) and four runner-up finishes (1996, 1999, 2004, 2007).

With all of his professional accomplishments, Pickler's biggest victories and proudest moments come when he sees his athletes move to four-year colleges and universities or the professional ranks. Over 200 student-athletes have received scholarships, and more than 120 players have been selected in the Major League Draft. There have been 15 former Cypress Chargers and several other Y-D alums who have been brought up to the Majors in Pickler's tenure.

Before coming to Cypress. Pickler had an outstanding high school coaching career. In six seasons at Savanna and Loara high schools, he posted a combined record of 123-36 and won the CIF championship with his 1983 Loara squad. Pickler is a 1968 graduate of Savanna (Calif.) High, winning Athlete of the Year recognition. He attended Cypress College and earned All-Conference recognition under Coach Larry Mercadante. He earned a degree in physical education from San Diego State University and played second base for the Aztecs.

Pickler and his wife Sharon have two children: Jeff and Kari. Jeff was an All-Conference choice for his father at Cypress in 1995 and then went on to be an All-American and All-Academic American at the University of Tennessee. Kari is a graduate of UCLA and was a Bruins Song Leader. She has performed on Broadway in the musical "Big", is the owner of The E-Factor, and is the mother of Scott's first grandchild. Pickler's younger brother Brad is the head coach of the softball team at Cypress and has led the Chargers to eight state championships.

James Cordes



Position: Assistant Coach Experience: Third Season Alma Mater: University of Redlands '04 / Boston College '08G

After stepping aside for the 2014 season, James Cordes returned to the Y-D Red Sox coaching staff in the spring of 2015. Cordes previously worked in the same capacity under Y-D manager

Scott Pickler from 2012-13.

In his previous stint with the Red Sox, Cordes helped tutor Y-D to a runner-up finish in the 2012 Cape Cod Baseball League Championship as well as an appearance in the Eastern Division Semifinals the following summer.

A native of Sun Valley, Idaho, Cordes played shortstop for four years at the University of Redlands (Calif.), majoring in history while playing with the Bulldogs. After finishing his undergraduate career, he moved into coaching. Cordes previously served as an assistant at UMass Boston from 2007 to 2008 and has held the same role with the Los Angeles Angels' Elite Scout Team since 2010. Additionally, he formerly aided the baseball program at Redlands East Valley (Calif.) High School, taking the reins of the Wildcats in 2008 and sitting at the helm since then.

Entering 2015, Cordes has compiled an overall record of 126-41-1 with REV and a 71-17 mark in Citrus Belt League play. In that timespan, he has guided the Wildcats to four CBL Championships.

A four-time CBL Coach of the Year, Cordes is proud of the REV players he has coached who have been drafted by Major League Baseball, and many more who have gone on to collegiate baseball careers in California and other states.

Cordes earned his Bachelor's degree in 2004 from Redlands and later earned his Master's in English at Boston College in 2008.

A former four-year letterwinner at the College of the Holv Cross. Matt Blake joined the Y-D Red Sox staff as an assistant coach in May of 2015.

Blake is the Owner and Director of Elite Pitching Development, which

he founded in 2009. In conjunction with his company, he is the Pitching Coordinator for Cressey Sports Performance's

Elite Baseball Development Program. This collaboration allows Matt and Cressey Sports Performance to manage the off-season throwing programs for over 100 professional, college and high school players each year.

Blake is also currently the Pitching Coach at Lincoln-Sudbury Regional High School since 2009. Previously, he was the Pitching Coordinator for the New England Ruffnecks college development program based out of Boston.

Additionally, he maintains a role as an Associate Scout for the New York Yankees in the Northeast region, where he has aided in the selection and coaching of the Northeast Yankees Area Code team since 2011.

The Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox announced the addition of Roberto Mercado to the team's staff in the spring of 2014. He enters his fifth season as head coach of the New Britain High School Hurricanes in New Britain. Conn. New Britain High School is in

the CCC West Conference, considered one of the best conferences in the state of Connecticut. In Mercado's inaugural year (2011), the Hurricanes captured their first conference title since 1984 and also made the LL state semifinals for the first time since 2001. Mercado has coached 13 All-Conference players and two All-State players in his time as head coach.

Prior to coaching at New Britain High School, he coached the New Britain Fall Legion baseball program and won state titles in 2007, 2009, and 2010.

He graduated in June 2012 with a degree in Sociology, finishing as a three-time Dean's List honoree.

After graduation, Torres played a summer of professional baseball with the Hawaii Stars of the North American Baseball League (NAL).

Clinics

The Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox Baseball Clinic, under the direction of manager Scott Pickler, offers instructional baseball clinics for boys and girls ages 5 years and up, geared to their individual needs and skills.
