

AARON JUDGE - FROM BREWSTER TO AMERICAN LEAGUE MVP

There was a time when Aaron Judge would come to the plate and the fans would not "All Rise" as they do today in homage to the 2022 Major League Baseball Player of the Year and reigning American League MVP for the New York Yankees.

It was during the summer of 2012 when the 6'7", 230lb outfielder was a starting outfielder for the Brewster Whitecaps, but not necessarily the physical specimen he would later become.

He had just finished sophomore season at Fresno State where he hit .320 with the Bulldogs which included 49 hits, 10 doubles, a triple and four home runs. In addition, he drove in 21 runs and stole 11 bases in 12 attempts.

He arrived on the Cape for the 12th game of the season with Brewster in the summer of 2012, coached by John Altobelli. After entering the game on June 28 and striking out in his first at bat, Judge hit a two-run homer in the eighth inning of a 7-3 loss to Yarmouth-Dennis.

"I just remember getting a call from his dad, before Aaron arrived, asking me if he thought we had a uniform big enough for him," recalled Whitecaps General Manager Ned Monthie.

In 32 games that season for the Whitecaps he came to bat 100 times with 27 hits for a .270 batting average. He had five home runs, three doubles and drove in 16 runs and scored 18 runs. In addition, the freeswinging Judge struck out 33 times while gaining 14 walks for the fifthplace Whitecaps.

"He arrived that season with a great big smile on his face; just a fantastic kid to have around," Monthie remembered. "He played hard, as both a position player, and any time he came up to the plate. Aaron always got a lot of attention." At the conclusion of the season, Judge was awarded the Brewster Whitecaps Citizenship Award.

"He was really an outstanding young man and the perfect example of a good citizen," said Claire Gradone, who was president of the Whitecaps during that season. "It was a very exciting time for us. Every day we had reporters and scouts there to watch

him. He really attracted a crowd." Judge was later selected by the Yankees with the 32nd pick in the first round of the 2013 MLB draft. In his Major League debut with the Yankees on Aug. 13, 2016, he homered in his first major league at bat off Tampa Bay pitcher Matt Andriese, who played in 2010 with Cotuit.

In 2017, he was named an All-Star, became the first rookie to win the Home Run Derby and finished the season with 52 home runs, breaking Mark McGwire's rookie record of 49. His rookie record stood for two years, until Pete Alonso (Bourne, 2015) hit 53 home runs in 2019.

Last season as AL Most Valuable Player, he set the American League record for home runs with 62 bettering Roger Maris' record of 61 set back in 1961. He also had 131 RBI. 391 total bases and 133 runs scored. To date, as the face of the Yankees franchise, Judge has hit 220 career home runs and drove in 497 runs with a lifetime .284 average over his first seven seasons.

After the 2022 season, Judge re-

signed with the Yankees with a nineyear, \$360 million contract and was named the team's captain. Some of the other former Cape League alumni who had memorable seasons in the Major Leagues last year include...

Jeremy Peña (Chatham 2017) achieved a unique postseason double last fall. The Astros rookie homered twice in the ALCS, including a threerun blast in the Game 4 clincher, (hitting .353, 6-for-17) to earn series MVP honors. Then in the World Series he became the first rookie position player named World Series MVP after hitting .400 with 10 hits and a 1.023 OPS in Houston's six-game victory. His biggest hit came in the Astros' win in Game 5, when Peña became the first rookie shortstop to homer in the World Series.

New York Mets' skipper **Buck** Showalter (Hyannis '76) became the first manager to capture Manager of the Year awards with four different teams, after leading his team to 101 wins in 2022. Showalter also won the

award while managing the Yankees, Baltimore and Texas.

Former Dodger Justin Turner (Y-D '05), who joined the Red Sox in the offseason, was last year's winner of the Roberto Clemente Award recognizing his humanitarian work, including the establishment of his own foundation and a continuing determination to help children battling deadly illnesses.

The following former Cape Leaguers won a Gold Glove for 2022: Yankee catcher **Jose Trevino** (Y-D '13) and utility player **D**. **J**. **LeMahieu** (Harwich '08), Cleveland pitcher Shane Bieber (Y-D '15), and Cubs outfielder and recent Cape League Hall of Fame inductee Ian Happ (Harwich '13-14).

New York Yankees outfielder Judge (Brewster '12) once again was

recipient of the Silver Slugger Award, joined by Mets second baseman Jeff McNeil (Brewster '12) and Phillies outfielder **Kyle Schwarber** (Wareham '12-13).

Members of the All-Major League Baseball first team were **Judge** and Toronto pitcher Alek Manoah (Chatham '18), while second team honorees were Dodger catcher Will Smith (Brewster '15), Schwarber and Phillies pitcher Aaron Nola (Harwich 12).

The current Boston Red Sox roster includes Cape Cod alumni **Turner** (Y-D '05), Chris Sale (Y-D '09), **Garrett Whitlock** (Chatham '17), Connor Wong (Bourne '16), Rob Refsnyder (Wareham '11), Bobby Dalbec (Orleans '14-15) and Jaren Duran (Wareham '17).



CAPE COD BASEBALL LEAGUE MARKS 100 YEARS IN 2023

According to author Christopher Price in his book *Baseball By The Beach*, the first reference to a Cape Cod Baseball League came in a July 9, 1923 story in the *Hyannis Patriot* which was headlined:

"Cape Cod Baseball League

A brand new base ball league was launched June 27th when representatives from Falmouth, Hyannis, Osterville and Chatham met and arranged a schedule of games for July and August.

The teams meet each other four times, twice in each town, making twelve games to be played. The opening game was in Hyannis July 7th with Osterville for the opposing team. Base ball excitement is running high in all the towns and a successful season is assured."

For the record, that season saw a round robin playoff for the championship with Hyannis beating Falmouth 14-13 in the first round. while Osterville edged Chatham 4-3. In the final game, Hyannis pulled out a brilliant 1-0 victory over Osterville for the first championship.

The early era of the league ran from 1923-39 before shutting down for six years during the World War 2 years. The league later resumed from 1946-62 prior to the so-called "Modern Era" which began in 1963 and runs to this day.

Over the course of the season, many teams will be commemorating the 100th year with their own individual celebrations and look back at their own successful pasts.

Here is a capsule rundown of each current team, its history from the early days to the present, as well as a listing of their championships. In addition, all of the defunct teams — even those who only played one season — are also noted in this brief 100-year history of the Cape Cod Baseball League.






2023 MLB DRAFT PREVIEW

The MLB Draft is an exciting occasion for players, fans, and front offices across the country. Many players selected early every summer come from the Cape League, with four of the last five first overall picks having Cape Cod experience, as well as ten first round selections in last year's draft. In total, 32% of all players selected last season played for the Cape League at some point. Here's a look at some Cape League alumni who expect to hear their name on July 9th.

Paul Skenes, RHP, Louisiana State

Paul Skenes (Wareham '21), the projected second overall pick by many sources, brings serious heat to the table. Skenes wields a fastball that averages 98.4 miles per hour, and has reached up to 102 on the season. His fastball also has impressive movement, averaging 17 inches of horizontal break. The Tiger righthander has used that fastball alongside his devastating slider to comfortably become the NCAA's leader in strikeouts, with his 164 across 86.2 innings leading second place by 40. Skenes' 1.77 ERA ranks fourth in the nation amongst qualified pitchers. Whichever team ends up with Paul Skenes will likely have an electric frontline starter to look forward to.





Jacob Wilson (Orleans '22), son of former Pirates All-Star Jack Wilson, is also expected to go in the early first round. Wilson has had an otherworldly season in Phoenix, posting a .425/.473/.665 slash line for the Antelopes. The Grand Canyon infielder also excels at putting the ball in play, recording more home runs (6) on the season than strikeouts (5), with his 5 Ks in 179 at-bats making him the toughest batter in the nation to strike out, a rate of once in every 35.8 at-bats. Wilson also excels defensively, being named the WAC Defensive Player of the Year. Wilson isn't the only exciting GCU prospect, as his teammate Homer Bush Jr. (Y-D '22), will also likely go sometime on early Day 2.

Enrique Bradfield, Jr., OF, Vanderbilt

Enrique Bradfield (Cotuit '22) is one of the most exciting players in the nation, plain and simple. Bradfield has 80-grade speed, stealing 127 bases in 139 attempts in his college career, including a 2022 season where he went uncaught in 46 tries. The

Vanderbilt outfielder impresses at the plate as well, posting a .317/.434/.453 triple slash across his three seasons. The Commodore also has impressive plate discipline, posting an elite 13% chase rate in 2023, and has walked more than he has struck out in each of his collegiate seasons. Bradfield projects as a top-of-the-order centerfielder, with his outstanding speed providing great range in the outfield. Whoever selects Enrique Bradfield will instantly have one of the most fun players in the sport to watch.

Matt Shaw, SS, Maryland

Matt Shaw (Bourne '22), last year's Cape League MVP, has continued to elevate his draft stock this season. Shaw returned to College Park this season and excelled, delivering a .361/.470/.747 slash line, recording 23 homers and 40 total extra-base hits. He also has plus speed, stealing 17 bases in 18 tries on the campaign. Shaw's 23 long balls on the year are tied for sixth in the nation, and his 66 RBI rank in the top 35. Matt Shaw is an incredibly well-rounded player that any team should be excited to have in their organization.



TROY

Brayden Taylor, 3B, Texas Christian

Brayden Taylor (Falmouth '22) has been one of the best hitters in college across his three seasons, and projects to be selected in the mid-first round. Taylor has a career .310/.440/.582 slash line, and has walked more times (149) than he has struck out (133). The TCU infielder has also shown an improved power stroke this season, increasing his home run total to 18 after hitting 13 last season. Brayden Taylor should provide an offensive jolt to the organization that selects him this July.

Tommy Troy, 3B, Stanford

Tommy Troy (Cotuit '22) came off a strong Cape League showing to become one of the best hitters in the nation in 2023. Troy is an incredibly versatile player, providing just about everything a team could need. He slashed .404/.485/.720 this season, with 31 extra-base hits and 16 stolen bases, while also playing a strong defensive third base. Troy's .404 batting average ranked in the top 25 nationally, with his .720 slugging in the top 50. Tommy Troy will be a fun prospect to watch for whoever drafts him.


