

**BOURNE BRAVES**

Doran Park, Upper Cape Tech, 220 Sandwich Road, Bourne  
[www.bournebraves.org](http://www.bournebraves.org) | Take Route 6 to Exit 1. Bear right off the exit and take the first left onto Adams Street. At the end of Adams Street, turn left on Sandwich Road (Route 6). Proceed along the canal. After the ice rink, the school driveway is on the left. The field is up the steep driveway behind the school.



**COTUIT KETTLEERS**

Lowell Park, 10 Lowell Street, Cotuit  
[www.kettleers.org](http://www.kettleers.org) | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Turn left on Putnam. Follow to Lowell Avenue on the right. The parking lot and field is on the right.



**FALMOUTH COMMODORES**

Guv. Fuller Field, 790 Main Street, Falmouth Center  
[www.falmouthcommodores.com](http://www.falmouthcommodores.com) | Take Route 6 to Exit 5 (Route 149). Bear left at the end of ramp onto Route 149. Stay to the right on Route 149 until the end. Bear right onto Route 28. Continue on Route 28 through Mashpee Rotary to Falmouth Center. The field is on the right behind the police station.



**HYANNIS HARBOR HAWKS**

McKeon Field, 120 High School Road, Hyannis

Turn right at the end onto Main Street. Keep in left lane on Main Street to High School Road Ext which dead-ends at the field.



**WAREHAM GATEMEN**

Clem Spillane Field, 54 Marion Road at Viking Drive, Wareham

At the end of Adams, turn left on Sandwich Road and follow to the Bourne Bridge. Take Route 25 across the bridge and proceed to Exit 2 (Route 6, Wareham). After passing through Wareham Center, Route 6 bears left up a hill. The field is on the left behind the Town Hall parking lot.





# Remembering Coach Cas

Early April for baseball fans is always a time of renewal, hope and anticipation, as baseball season begins once again. But this April, for many in the baseball world, it was a time of great sadness with the loss of a true gentleman of the game. Rolando Casanova, affectionately known as Coach Cas or just Cas, died on April 12 of cancer. He was only 57.

Cas was born in Havana, Cuba, during a violent, turbulent time in the country, as Castro's revolutionary forces waged guerrilla warfare which led to the overthrow of the Batista regime in 1959. Fearful of the future, the family made the momentous decision to leave their home, and they settled in Miami in 1961 when Cas was 5 years old.

Growing up to become a talented athlete, Cas was an infielder for Loyola High School and Florida International University, then known as the Sunblazers. After college, he began his coaching career at Miami's St. Thomas University, and then moved on to both of his alma maters – first as Loyola's head coach, and then as an assistant coach at FIU for nearly a quarter of a century. During his tenure, the team enjoyed success at both the Division II and I levels; the 1995 team (known by then as the Golden Panthers) won 50 games, still a

school record, and the 2001 team is the only FIU team to reach the NCAA super regionals.

Cas brought his coaching expertise to the Cape League in 1988, becoming the Field Manager for the Brewster Whitecaps in their 1988 inaugural season. He joined the Orleans Cardinals in 1992, after long-time skipper John Castleberry left to become a scout and recommended that Cas

season, Cas made the decision to devote his summers to overseeing the baseball futures of his two sons, Adrian and Gabriel. After just five years at the helm, the list of Orleans players he recruited and coached who went on to major league careers is truly impressive: Jon Adkins, Aaron Boone, Jason Dellaero, John Gall, Nomar Garciaparra, Todd Helton, Wayne Gomes, Jonathan Johnson,

Florida and Latin America. Cancer first struck in 2006, but Cas battled back until early this year, when treatments were no longer effective. When hospice was called in, the news spread quickly in the baseball world, and hundreds of friends and colleagues feared the worst. After his death, the Tigers held a moment of silence in his honor at Comerica Park. At the visitation, countless former players talked of the impact he'd had on their lives. Mickey Lopez (Orleans 1994) summed it up perfectly: *Coach Cas, thank you for being a light in the world. You truly were one of the very few coaches who taught his players about life, which is what we will take away from the great game of baseball at the end of the day.*

Rolando Casanova leaves his beloved wife of 36 years, Sylvia; his sons Adrian and Gabriel; Adrian's wife Gil and their daughters Victoria and Valentina; his parents, Rolando, Sr. and Ana; and his sister Annie. He was predeceased by his younger brother Eddie, who died at age 23 of cancer. Rolando died on Eddie's birthday, at the same hour of the day that Eddie had been born – a fitting coda to the life of a man of deep and abiding faith, steadfast commitment and unshakable loyalty. ○

Coach Cas, thank you for being a light in the world. You truly were one of the very few coaches who taught his players about life, which is what we will take away from the great game of baseball at the end of the day.

replace him. Cas ran a tight ship and he coached with the utmost respect for the game, but he was always a player's coach, a mentor and teacher who knew what each player needed, and he spared no effort in supporting and guiding them. In 1993, a magical season, he led the team to the CCBL championship. Cas loved Eldredge Park and thought it was "the closest place to heaven, without being there."

## ELDREDGE PARK Home of the Orleans Firebirds

**W**elcome to historical Eldredge Park, home of the Firebirds. Named the “best summer collegiate ballpark in the nation” in 2004 by Baseball America, this picturesque park has served the town of Orleans for over 100 years. Over this time, substantial work has been completed to maintain, improve and modernize the park, most recently through privately donated funding and without a single penny of local taxpayer support. Today, Eldredge Park provides the town with a

beautiful facility and ambiance once described by Philadelphia Reporter Joe Parillo as “a Norman Rockwell painting come to life.” Below lays a historical perspective on the park.

### Appropriation of Eldredge Park

Back in the early 1900s, a local gentleman named Lewis Winslow ‘Win’ Eldredge (1861-1944) was working towards his goal of providing a bigger and better park for the town. Over the years, he acquired about 250 acres of land in central Orleans. At a special town meeting

on May 16, 1913, a committee “consisting of George C. Dyer, Louis W. Eldredge and Edgar Upham,” was directed to report at the next town meeting the price and location of a public playground and prove it could be “procured on reasonable terms.” At that subsequent town meeting, Mr. Louis W. Eldredge offered to present the town in “consideration of my affection for and interest in the young people of Orleans and my desire to provide a playground for them,” a ten-acre plot located near the old “Poor Farm.” In exchange the committee

Much of the work was done in the late afternoon and early evenings, as well as on weekends by volunteers, who had to fit their time around regular business hours. It was a rather festive atmosphere most of the time, with much positive attention from the town in general and passersby. When there was a large group working the late summer afternoons and evenings, Charlie Moore would go uptown and muscle “Jolly Jack” Tartaglia or the owner of another restaurant for burgers, fries and drinks for the workers, which could be 8-20 strong.

The new Eldredge Field was “an immaculate diamond of velvet turf infield on a beautiful site... a masterpiece that off-field sports writers are calling one of the finest community ball fields in all of New England.” The park debuted on July 23, hosting the 1967 Cape Cod Baseball League All-Star game, and “was played in bright sunlight after 20 successive days of fog and rain.” Much pomp and circumstance surrounded the grand opening. The record crowd of 2000 spectators included Massachusetts’s

governor John C. Volpe, who arrived (along with Lieutenant governor Francis W. Sergeant and Attorney General Elliott Richardson) via helicopter to give a brief dedication speech. A color guard of the Orleans Sea Scouts raised the flag in center field as the Orleans band played the National Anthem, sung by 1967 Miss Orleans Tracy Smith. Just before the game, Selectman Charles F. Moore of Orleans received a surprise citation and a large and magnificently

wrapped gift from an anonymous donor, “for all Charlie has done in, around and for the ball field over the past year.” Another surprise feature was the use of a golf cart, provided by Charlie Moore, to bring in pitchers from the bullpen to the mound. The Lower Cape All-Stars, featuring catchers Thurman Munson of Chatham and Cal Fisk (brother of Carlton) of Harwich, defeated the Upper Cape squad 9-1. (Cape Codder, July 27, 1967)

In 1972, new dugouts were built, consisting of block bunkers in the ground with concrete block stairs going down into them. The tops of the dugouts were made of galvanized pipe framing with canvas stretch over them.

done. (Cape Codder, July 13, 1967)

Work to convert the field to its current town configuration began in 1966 and carried on into 1967. (The Cardinals played at the adjacent Nauset Regional High School for the 1966 season). The late Charles F. Moore Jr. organized a band of volunteers and raised the funds for several capital improvements. Several very large locust trees along the 3rd

received an appropriation of \$500 to grade and arrange the grounds. In the annual town meeting on February 2, 1914, another \$1500 was given to further the process.<sup>1</sup>

### Cape Cod Baseball – The Modern Era (1963 to present)

Established 130 years ago, the CCBL officially entered the Modern Era in 1963.

The NCAA sanctioned the league at that time, enabling the eight initial franchises to recruit the best college players from across the country, filling rosters once populated with town players.

To keep up with the times, major renovations to the park were initiated in 1966. The first step was a sum of \$10,000 granted at the 1966 Town Meeting, “for the purpose of rehabilitating the recreational facilities at Eldredge Field.” An additional \$20,000 was then raised to complete the project, including addition of a music shell, new tennis courts, picnic areas and other recreational facilities provided for in the master plan. This additional funding was raised by the sponsoring efforts of the Orleans Recreation League, Inc., the Orleans Rotary Club and many individuals. From the beginning, the facilities were installed under the supervision of the Orleans Park Commission, with substantial assistance from the Water and Highway departments. Renovations were made possible by the efforts of hundreds of individuals, many of who worked after hours and without remuneration to get the job

base line were removed to accommodate a new backstop. Nate Ellis and Ray Perreault, who were frequently on-site throughout the reconstruction, provided large earthmoving equipment, necessary for the reconfiguration. Joe Mooney, then a long time groundskeeper for Fenway Park, made numerous trips to Orleans to oversee the mixing and creation of the native soils to make the best base paths and loamy soils one could muster. Coinciding with the reconfiguration, the town installed a basic irrigation system, using heavy cast iron pipe buried 5 feet deep to be below the frost line, a method typically employed when constructing street water mains.

### Terracing the Long Hill Along Right Field Line Transforms Eldredge Park

One of the most distinctive elements of Eldredge Park is the steep hill that runs all the way down the right side of the field. The hill was almost impossible to sit on comfortably and prevented many elderly people from getting a closer view. The idea to create terraces along that hillside came from Fred Perreault, who with Russ Ford, and in cooperation with the school committee and the Town Park Department, teamed to create design sketches and carry out the work. This significant effort took place between 1985-1986, greatly improving the comfort of fans, increasing seating capacity to an estimated 6000 people while creating a unique setting that is the envy of the Cape League and community ballparks throughout New England.

In December, 2005, a big wind came through the Cape, knocking down the row of locust trees along Rte. 28 next to the field. Paul Fulcher, the Park Department and Fred Perreault subsequently created terraces along the 3rd base side.

The original field lighting was installed for the 1979 season, again financed by private donations. In 2000, it was replaced by the current Musco system, a joint project of the town and the team. A new electric scoreboard replaced the old manually operated version for the 1982 season, financed by Russ Ford and other matching donations, and it served until the 2007 season when another group of donors raised funds for its replacement. Both dugouts were expanded with the help of the

local amateur soccer team, Fred Perreault, Harry Hossfeld and some additional helpers. This was needed as the Cape League continued to expand its rosters, making the dugouts cramped and uncomfortable.

About this same time, the very first press box, named the Birds Nest, was built Phil Bergson. However, around 1990 the organization entered a new phase, marketing team clothing and other souvenirs, so an extensive addition was made to the original small storage shed behind home plate. The volunteers who operated this new retail shop generated a significant

amount of revenue towards the teams’ annual budget. In 2003, the Bird’s Nest was completely replaced by Mark Hossfeld, Billy Edwards and Mark’s son Matt, and formally named for Ed Mooney, honoring his many years of dedication to the Orleans organization, including the annual yearbook and peerless announcing.

### The Yawkey Foundation Grants

In 2004, the Yawkey Foundation began making a series of \$150,000 grants to each of the leagues ten organizations. Bourne and Brewster received the first grants, which led to the creation of new ballparks for each community. These grants, now totaling \$1.5M, are part of a continuing effort to sustain and revitalize the areas playing fields, helping towns, the community and children gain access to the joys of baseball.

In 2009, Orleans and Yarmouth-Dennis were the last teams to receive grants, which were contingent upon the community to match the \$150,000 and to commit substantial “sweat equity” labor. Staged in phases, the park underwent \$322,000 worth of improvements. These were made possible by \$52,000 worth of labor, as well as skill, donated by local businesses and residents. Together the phases would enhance the safety, entertainment value and playing conditions of the field, again, without any burden on local taxpayers.

**Phase 1**, completed prior to 2010 season, resulted in new, 48’ long state-of-the-art dugouts, complete with New England styled bead boarding, at a cost of \$134,000 each. A knee-high padded brick wall backstop was constructed and about \$60,000 was invested in new safety netting that extended 180’ down each foul line. Foul polls and a centerfield flagpole were also added.

**Phase 2** was completed in 2011, focused on improving the playing surface. The entire infield was excavated to a level 5 feet underground, and then layered with clay and sod. Sports Turf Specialists, Inc., regarded as the top field construction and maintenance organization in all of New England, designed and installed the turf. Their clients over the years have included the New York Mets, Boston Red Sox, Lowell Spinners and Boston College. Sophisticated laser-guided instruments were used to level the field. Warning tracks were widened from 8 to 15 feet to conform to NCAA guidelines. Both bullpens were fully restored to their original condition and the safety netting was raised to 20'. Finally, the brick wall was water-proofed, a drainage system down the right field line was installed and distinctive signage was added to the dugout, reading "Home of the Orleans Firebirds."

**Phase 3** was completed prior to the 2013 season, and included a new sprinkler system (supplied by its own well in 2014), for which the town had appropriated funds at several town meetings. Fred Perreault, with the help of local contractor John Martin cleared out two overgrown and unsightly groves, above the home plate area and adjacent to the left

field foul pole, greatly enhancing the expansive, open feel of the park. Finally, bleachers were converted from wood to aluminum, with new sets added beyond the outfield fence.

**Planned for Phase 4**, and beginning in fall of '14, is expansion of the Birds Nest to increase size of press box and the Home Plate Shop.

Over the last 100 years, Eldredge Park has served the town of Orleans in many ways, from hosting Pops in the Park, soccer games, tennis matches, music in the Band Shell, performances by the United States Marine Drum and Bugle Corps, and of course, thousands of baseball games. The Orleans community has coupled a vision with an unparalleled commitment from residents, local business owners and countless volunteers to build, maintain and constantly improve a ballpark that has become the envy of the Cape League. "We take real pride in calling Eldredge Park our home field and we'll do our best to keep it. We want our fans to enjoy the experience of coming to the ballpark and make them feel like they are at a professional game but with the same small town feel," said John Kaletski, Board Member of the franchise. George Mitrovich, San Diego Civic Leader, summed up Eldredge Park in a 1998 Letter to the Boston Globe, "Some teams play in ballparks with lights, some without. Some play in forgettable surroundings and some, like the Firebirds in Orleans, play in a sylvan setting so transcendently beautiful one's breath is swept away." ◊



## KELLY NICHOLSON, FIELD MANAGER

Loyola High School of Los Angeles | Hometown: Manhattan Beach, CA

Orleans is indeed fortunate to welcome Coach Nicholson back for his 14<sup>th</sup> summer here – his 10<sup>th</sup> as Field Manager, the longest tenure for an Orleans skipper in the “modern era” (1963-present).

Kelly (or Coach K as he’s known in the pitching fraternity) is a native of Corona, California where he won numerous scholar-athlete awards in both baseball and basketball while in high school. He was a four-year letterwinner and two-time all-conference pick during his pitching career at Loyola Marymount University. After earning his bachelor’s degree in business administration from LMU, he began his career teaching mathematics at Loyola High School of Los Angeles, while completing his master’s degree in education from LMU. He was the head coach of

the Loyola HS Cubs for eleven seasons, where he led the team to seven playoff appearances and a league title. Kelly then spent three seasons as Loyola Marymount’s pitching coach, and each year the Lions won the WCC title and went to the NCAA regionals. In the summer of 2000, Kelly worked with the Team USA pitching staff in its early preparation for international play. Kelly joined Orleans as the pitching coach in 2001. In 2002, Coach K’s staff had a 2.11 ERA (the best ever by Cardinals pitchers) and in 2004 it led the CCBL with a 2.37. His 2003 championship pitching staff was lights out, with a 2.36 ERA and a league-leading 397 Ks in 401 IP.


Co-winner of the Hossfeld Spirit Award with Coach Steve DeBlasi in 2004, Kelly became

the field manager in 2005, and was the unanimous choice of his fellow managers for the CCBL Mike Curran Manager of the Year Award after leading the Cardinals to a record-setting 30-win season and the championship. Coach K was again named Manager of the Year in 2008 as his squad finished the regular season in first place overall (25-17-2), but a heartbreaking 1-0, 18-inning loss to the eventual CCBL Champion Harwich Mariners ended the team’s playoff run. Under his leadership, Orleans is a perennial playoff contender, reaching the final round in 2013 against Cotuit, despite losing several key players to injury. Coach K’s overall winning percentage of .566 leads the East Division.

It’s no surprise to anyone who knows him that Kelly enjoys the

respect, affection and admiration of his players, fellow coaches and colleagues here and around the league and in the wider baseball community; he’s a favorite around town, having made countless friends over the years. Orleans fans know they’ll see a first class team on the field every summer with Kelly at the helm.

Kelly recently established his “ABC” or Academy of Baseball and Character, where young players “learn to play the game the right way.” We can attest to that. Orleans welcomes a true gentleman and a terrific leader back for his fourteenth summer. ○

# An interview with Mark Hallberg

2006 Firebird shortstop returns in 2014 as an assistant coach

**W**hat will your role and duties be on Kelly's coaching staff?

I'll be coaching the defense, perhaps coaching 1<sup>st</sup> base, helping out with batting practice. I was drafted as a SS and throughout my career have played everywhere, including 2nd, 3<sup>rd</sup>, and 1st. I really got a chance to understand them all and learn about the game.

**What did you consider your strength as a player?**

Defense was my calling card, my "plus tool." I also had good plate discipline, was a contact hitter and understood the game. I felt the game was slow for me, even at the highest level. That's because I felt I had a good knowledge base about what was going on.

**At Florida State in 2007, you were the most difficult hitter to strike out in the nation (just 20 times in 250 at bats) What is your two-strike mindset at the plate?**

It's a combination of being blessed with good hand eye coordination and being disciplined within my approach. Looking outside to in, looking for fastball first, reacting to off-speed, not guessing, then trust in your hands and yourself that you're not going to get beat. If I could just get to the next pitch, maybe the pitcher would make a mistake, maybe the next pitch would be one I could handle better. Battling was huge, even on pitcher's pitches, not giving in, just trying to get a piece was key. You can even impact the game by getting an out, if you go deep into the count, make the pitcher labor and get into the opponents' bullpen. I remember watching Dustin Pedroia against Jared Weaver. It was a 10 or 11



pitch at bat, including hitting a ball off his leg, before singling up the middle. I think he's a great example of the mindset you want in those situations.

**Do you have a middle infielder you patterned your game after?**

Derek Jeter. He played shortstop, is a hard-nosed player, a natural leader and a Champion. He's handled himself well with the NY media and constantly being in the spotlight.

**Are there any other athletes you looked up to?**

Kirby Puckett, probably because of game 6 of 1991 World Series against the Braves. He made a tremendous catch off the Plexiglas and then hit a walk off homer to send it to game 7. The big thing with Kirby, he enjoyed what he was doing. Also Bret Favre. Being from Wisconsin, my mom's a die-hard Packers fan. He had that gunslinger mentality; he's tough, passionate and always seemed to have fun. Even under pressure and stress, he could enjoy it because he was well prepared.

**You played for Kelly Nicholson here in 2006. How would you describe his coaching style?**

He was great. He's really there for you, not only as a ballplayer but as a person as well. He truly wants all his players to succeed. I'd call him a player's coach, and he's very passionate about what

he does. He helps you identify what kind of player you are and is willing to guide you, while holding you accountable. More of a Phil Jackson type, preferring to sit back and observe. But don't be fooled by his demeanor, because the passion is there. I'm looking forward to learning from him and coaching with him this summer.

**Kelly is known as a pitching coach, what does he bring in this area?**

He's able to handle the entire pitching staff. You have all these D1 prospects and you don't want to burn them out, as the college coaches are watching. He wants them to develop and get those quality experiences, but also win.

**What are Major League scouts looking for in a prospect?**

In my experience, every scout approaches assessing and evaluating talent differently. Besides the five tools, I believe scouts are looking for mental toughness and attitude. They want to see how a player responds to adversity in the game, game to game, at bat to at bat and even pitch to pitch? The Cape is a really good league for that, especially for hitters. Also,

do you play hard and respect the game, and do you play with confidence? Do you run hard down the line even though you're frustrated? Do you have the desire to be great? The other thing they

look for is a big league tool. What makes you different, what are you going to bring to the table?

**What advice will you give the players when playing in front of scouts?**

One of the nice things about this job is having been through this process, I can relate to the players well. Control what you can control. I'll tell them three things, trust yourself, compete hard, and have fun.

**The Cape League is different from college ball in requiring the use of wood bats. What's the biggest adjustment from aluminum players will have to make?**

It's different for every hitter. The biggest adjustment for me

was learning to hit the ball the other way and increasing my "barrel awareness," learning to hit the ball on the sweet spot of the bat. The wood bat does two things in my opinion. First, it improves your path to the ball, it shortens your swing. If you have a long swing, it usually results in many broken bats, so you figure that out real quick. Second, it improves your approach at the plate. You learn what your strengths and weaknesses are because it's hard to cover the entire plate when you're facing a guy with plus stuff. So you must have a disciplined approach up there.

**Do you have any particular memory of playing at Eldredge Park?**

It's such a great field, the best environment, because of the hill and great fan support. There are two that stand out. First, Matt Wieters (Orleans '06) hit a homer off the top of the clubhouse in right center; it may have even been a walk-off homer. The other thing was the beautiful mornings and spending time at the youth

baseball camps.

**Speaking of Matt Wieters, he's a 2-time MLB all-star with the Orioles and was inducted into the CCBL HoF last September. What makes him special?**

He's passionate about baseball and puts in the time. He's always the first guy at the park. He's well prepared and good defensively. The game is slow for him because he understands it so well. Plus, he's a 6'5" switch hitting catcher with power.

**Do you have a favorite road ballpark in the league?**

I always liked Y-D for two reasons. First, it was a great atmosphere. There used to be open space down the lines filled with fans in lawn chairs. Second, the fences were so short that I actually had a chance to hit a homer.

**You played with Buster Posey (Y-D '06-07) at Florida State – what kind of an athlete is he?**

He's a great ballplayer, but he's an even better person. What separates him from a lot of other players is his mental toughness, discipline, focus, smarts and he has all the physical tools to go with those attributes. He's consistent and plays with humble confidence. His glove is really good as well – he's underrated in that area because his bat is so good.

**What other great players have you played with?**

The two most complete players were Paul Goldschmidt and Buster. I played with Paul in AA, first baseman of the Diamondbacks. He's a beast, short stroke for a big guy, stays back on the ball well – and is starting to emerge. Both guys have that mental toughness, that consistency which separates them from other players.

**Who's the toughest pitcher you ever faced?**

It depended on the matchups. In AAA I faced a guy named Maikel Cleto (now with the Chicago White Sox); he was throwing 99-102 mph. The ball got on you quick. There's a difference between 92 and 96 and then between 96 and 100. I'll always remember that at bat. Craig Kimbrel (Atlanta Braves) is probably



another guy that I would consider. Trevor Cahill (Arizona Diamondback) had a real heavy sinker. Alexi Ogando (Texas Rangers). In college, it was Joe Smith (Los Angeles Angels). So many good pitchers that I was able to face hard to nominate just one.

**What are your memories of Orleans and what are you looking forward to when you come back this summer?**

The people in Orleans are just great, and I always say the people make the place. The Orleans folks are just good people. Secondly, my favorite place in town is being at Eldredge Park, with a packed hill, under the lights and a good ballgame. That environment is pretty cool, and that's what Orleans is about in the summer time. There isn't another place I'd rather be than there. ○





# Highly Coveted Internships Provide Valuable Experience

Suzi Mellano spent two years (2012-2013) as a broadcast intern for the Orleans Firebirds. Suzi grew up in San Diego and is currently a junior at TCU. She describes her experience with the Firebirds and its impact on her life and career.

### Why were you interested in an internship with the Firebirds and how did you earn the assignment?

I started playing baseball as a 4 year-old, and even played Little League. In high school I started keeping statistics for the baseball team, so I've been around the game my whole life. I'm also familiar with the CCBL, as my uncle played for Wareham in the summer of '83. My high school coach in San Diego knew Kelly Nicholson. So the Firebirds were the only team I applied to. I submitted a resume and some broadcast samples of my work, did some research online. I received a call in December, completed a phone interview and was offered the job in January.

### What were your responsibilities during the internship?

My first year I did pre, during and post-game interviews while helping out with game day operations. I also ran the Twitter account. I added the Featured Firebirds my second year, which were videos of light-hearted player interviews ([www.orleans-firebirds.com/category/featured-firebird](http://www.orleans-firebirds.com/category/featured-firebird)). Broadcast teams on the Cape are very competitive, just like the players. We wanted to put us a step above other Cape teams, and believe Featured Firebirds did just that. It was a great way for fans to get to know the players while having some fun.

### Can you describe your living arrangements in Orleans?

My parents paid for my first summer. I rented a little house with several others. It turned out to be a circus with people from all over the world staying there. I was completely on my own the second summer, as my parents didn't provide a single penny. I rented a tiny one-bedroom attic apartment in Orleans with two other interns. We paid \$158 each per week. I had to work two jobs just to make ends meet.



Every morning I arrived at the Orleans Inn at 6:30am, and then went straight to the ballpark. I also cleaned vacation rentals on weekends. I've never been so broke in my life. It was horrible, but I'd do it again in a heartbeat.

### What are some of your favorite memories of Orleans and the Firebirds?

Orleans in general is just a very special place. I immediately felt so comfortable, and it's so beautiful. It's just a happy place that I have become very attached to. I'm a huge fan of the bike trail. I didn't have a car my first summer, so I rode my bike to the field. It is so peaceful and never overcrowded. Honestly, when I'm married and with a family, I'd like to buy a house in town so I can follow the Firebirds for the rest of my life.

Everyone involved with the Firebirds franchise is just awesome. Becoming close to our broadcast crew, Sam, Kevin and Matt, cemented lifelong friendships. The coaches, Kelly, Bennie and Brownie, were terrific, along with all the players. We all have one thing in common, that love for baseball. That bond is so strong. It's remarkable how you come together like that in such a short period of time. While the baseball was great, it's the people I'm never going to forget.

### What is it about the game of baseball that is so special to you?

To me it's the classiest of sports, and very American. It's a different pace and an acquired taste. It's my style, in a setting where

everyone is happy and enjoying themselves. You really need to understand the game to enjoy it like we all do. In my opinion, people who don't like baseball simply don't know it.

### What did you learn working with the Firebirds for those two years?

How much of a grind the season is. Two full months with just a few days off. We had to be at the field early and stayed late to complete post-game interviews. I now have a better understanding of what professional baseball will be like. I also learned how to be comfortable in front of the camera, develop a more conversational style to my interviews. It gave me a great idea of exactly what I want to do.

### How has this experience helped you prepare for a future in broadcasting?

I want to be a reporter for MLB network, that's my big one. Definitely a career in baseball. I worked for Fox Sports in Dallas last semester and they had me fill in for one of their reporters. They completely trusted me because they had seen my work with the Firebirds. I did three on-camera interviews a day on the Cape. If that doesn't make you comfortable, nothing will.

### Do you have any advice for the incoming interns?

Don't be afraid to go far away from home, to go outside your comfort zone. You're afforded much creative license with the Firebirds, so capitalize on this great opportunity. ○

## OUR CLINIC PHILOSOPHY

The co-ed clinic is dedicated to teaching the fundamentals of baseball. Skills and technical instruction will cover throwing,

catching, fielding, hitting and base running. All level of abilities are identified, and all instruction is based on the age, ability and playing

experience of each boy and girl. A high instructor to child ratio ensures that each boy and girl receives personal attention and direction.



## GENERAL INFORMATION

All participants receive instruction from the manager, coaches and Firebirds, as well as a t-shirt, and an opportunity to "run with the 'Birds." 'Campers of the Week' also will be awarded at the conclusion of each clinic.

Clinics are held weekly beginning June 23 and continuing through August 1 at Nauset Middle School (adjacent to Eldredge Park). They run from 9 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Water breaks and a nutrition break will take

place daily, so attendees should bring snacks and water, in addition to their baseball gear.

Cost is \$100/week or \$25/day. There also are specialty clinics in pitching, catching and hitting for \$40 per session. You




